# STAGE SET FOR NEW MURDER CASE TRIAL

Day Brings Completion of Panel; Defense Pleads Justifiable Homicide

Daniel J. Moon, 56, shot and killed Jack Lemmon here last July 11, but the homicide was justifiable, Frank L. Moon's statement at Moon's second trial on a first degree murder charge in district court here yesterday. The jury disagreed at the first trial last September.

Little difficulty was experienced yesterday in selection of the jury of 12 and two alternates; the panel being completed at 9:20 P. M.

Prosecution and defense attorneys both made opening statements before adjournment of the first day's proceedings.

Differences between the stories of the fatal shooting as related by E. M. Larson, prosecuting attorney, on the one hand, and by Mr. Stephen on the other, was largely in point of view, except as to the shooting itself. Both agreed that there had been trouble between Moon and Lemmon, who was a lodger at a near-by residence, about a year before the shooting and that there had been a sort of truce between the two continuing until the day of the fatal shooting.

According to the prosecutor's version, Moon called Lemmon back after Lemmon had started away from in front of the Moon residence where a verbal altercation had taken place and shot him in the face as he turned back in answer to Moon's call.

Moon fired when Lemmon started toward him reaching toward his hip pocket after he had threatened Moon with a .384.

Steinberg said he had appealed from conviction in Lemhi county, but Sheriff Stroud said no bond had been posted to be proposed executing sentence calling for six months in jail and a fine of \$100.

Steinberg Delays Plea  
The Lemhi county sheriff appeared on the scene here yesterday when Steinberg, in response to telephoned summons, appeared in justice court to answer to the charge of shipping a carload of inferior potatoes from Twin Falls last May 4, in bags branded U. S. No. 1 grade, which bags were found to be misbranded with his attorneys before appearing in court. He waived himself of his privilege to defer his plea until today.

Annual immediately thereafter the Lemhi county sheriff took him in charge and, overriding Steinberg's protest, started out to take him back to Lemhi. The assistant attorney general, who is assisting the prosecuting attorney in prosecutions of this and three other charges of shipping misbranded potatoes filed against a number, intervened to delay Steinberg's departure for one day at least.

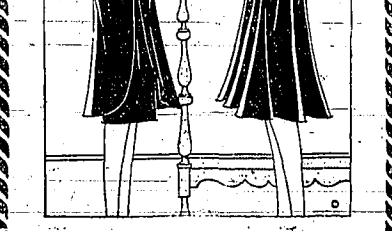
