# Science Combats Fungi to Save Panama Paintings

## Best Chemical Minds of America and Europe Collaborate in Winning Fight

Work of New York Artist Shows Scenes Now 50 Feet Under Water and Pictures Stand Alone in Vault Historically

Van Ingen, of the art school of Cooper Union, New York, supervised the fungicidal campaign, and some of the best chemical minds of America and Europe collaborated in

The determination to save the most important of tropical paintings, which one after another have been mastered in making the canal, differed from anything which modern art heretofore has faced.

Fungi have attacked smaller paintings before, and have been killed off, but entirely new methods, said Mr. Van Ingen, had to be devised for the canal murals, which cover 400 square feet and have 200 pounds of white lead holding them to the walls of the administrative building.

The fungi are a vegetable parasite species of mold. Mr. Van Ingen said they spread in clusters of green and white, resembling damp talcum powder. In spots he found the mold apparently eaten down to the canvas, less than 15 years after the paintings had been completed.

The new treatment was devised by Professor A. B. Newman, director of the department of chemical engineering of Cooper Institute, New York, with co-operation of Dr. Charles Thom, chief mycologist of the bureau of plant industry, Washington, D. C., and Alexander Scott of the British museum, D. C. B. Lodge of the New York botanical gardens and other mold experts.

Originally the paintings had been covered with a protective varnish of beeswax. This was washed off with acetone turpentine and alcohol baths. A wash of thymol was discovered to be effective in exterminating the fungi, even to the deep-seated spores.

Then ammonia washed off the dead fungi, and the pictures were safeguarded for the future with a coating of paraffin mixed with thymol. Temperature records of 10 years were examined to learn what mixture would keep the paraffin from melting or deteriorating.

Thymol is a compound found in oils of thyme and rosemary, and used as an antiseptic. It has an aromatic odor.

"This," said Mr. Van Ingen, "was inexplicable but satisfactory. The paintings appeared as though they had been executed the day before, and there had not been applied a bushful of paint to them since 1915."
