# Oregon and Florida Wind up Preparation for Final Clash

## Webfoot Eleven and Gators Have Equal Chance for Victory

Aggregations Well-Matched in Scoring Ability, Year's Percentages of Losses and Triumphs and Weight

(By The Associated Press) MIAMI, Fla., Dec. 6.—Football teams from two corners of the nation today wound up preparations for the Oregon-Florida football game tomorrow with light workouts in the Windsor Square Garden corporation's big wooden stadium.

The Oregon Webfoots, re-climated through several Southern games earlier in the season and by a train ride over the southern part of the United States to Miami, did not find the semi-tropical weather of Miami more discomforting than did the Gators from Gainesville. Weather predictions for tomorrow are, generally, fair and warm.

The teams, having the scales of approximately the same average weight, will take to the field with approximately the same records as 10 games won and lost in 1929.

**Similar Records**  
The Oregon aggregation has won seven of its contests and lost two—its record being 7-2. Gainesville has a similar record, having lost to Georgia Tech and Harvard.

High teams had regarded the game they lost as their heaviest contest of the year.

Approximately 20,000 seats to the game had been sold tonight.

Announcement of probable lineups by Coach John J. McSwain, Oregon, and Coach Charles Bachmann, Florida, showed that only one or two really heavyweights would see the beginning of the game from the side lines.

**Regular Line-ups to Play**  
Web Diegel, Florida, all-American end in 1928, has not recovered sufficiently from early season injuries and will not play. Bachmann said. Fred Heibel, first Florida halfback, who had been out of practice line-ups this week, worked out for a part of the brief time today, but, his teaming, however, except in case of dire necessity, Bachmann said.

Further, regular right end for the Oregon team, probably will give way at the start of the game to Archer. McSwain announced. Other members of his squad, he said, are in good condition with the exception of Erdley, left end, who has been handicapped by a bad leg.

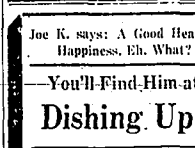

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 6.—Championship hopes of Walter Hagen crashed on the fairways of Hillcrest today when the expert waterer of golfism bowed to the superior play of Leo Diegel, defending title holder, 3 and 2, in the semifinals of the National Professional Golfers' tournament.

Setting his seven Professional Golfers' association title, Hagen saw his chances swept away before a rush of pars and birdies that streaked from one club to his next, until the opponent who a year ago eliminated him from the ranks of contenders, Diegel, that sub-par golfer, Hagen put. It is the answer to the advance of the slender "pro" from Agua Caliente, Mexico, and the reversal of a challenge, who now holds the British open title, has twice set on the national open three and five times, in the past, has ruled the most in the Professional Golfers' association circuit.

While Diegel met and matched the challenge of Hagen, Johnny Farrell, New York, cruised through his last to eliminate Al Watrous, Detroit, by a score of 6 and 5 victory. Sailing, Johnny fought his way back from the brink of defeat yesterday when he came from behind to nose out Chas. E. Bloomfield, New Jersey, on the thirty-seventh, but his conquest today came without much exertion. As the result of his victory he will face the veteran tournament in the 36-hole final.

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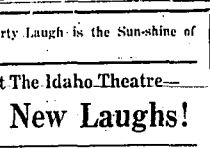
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## Cougar Eleven Wins 21 of 26 Grid Games

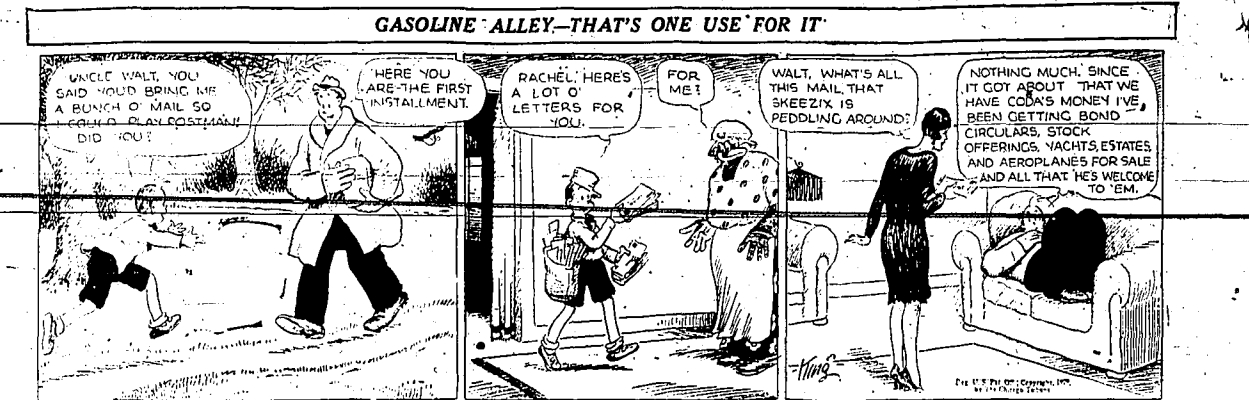
