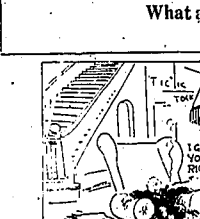

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30.—Incorporation of the \$30,000,000 cotton marketing association by January 15 and early relocation of facilities and personnel for the Farm Board Cotton Marketing Commission has promised the federal farm board tonight as Chairman Leage and Carl Williams, member representing cotton in Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

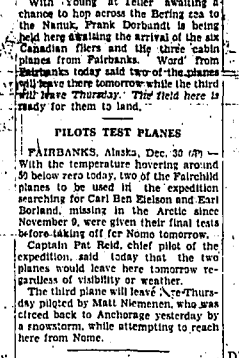

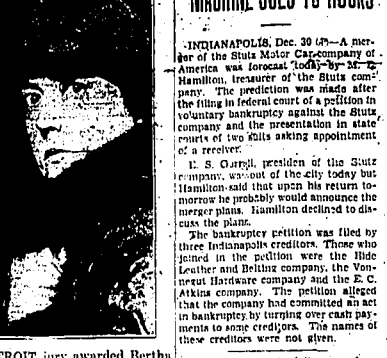
PILOTS TEST PLANES

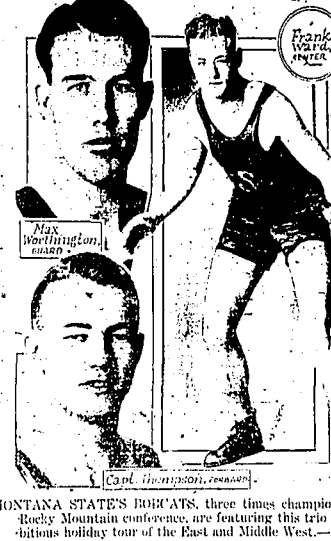
