WATERUSERS CARRY QUARREL TO COURT

Tribunal Orders Officials To Show Why Contract in Case Should Not Be Broken

BOISE, March 7.—An application of a group of taxpayers of the Little Lost Lake valley today caused the state land board and commissioner of reclamation to show cause on March 17 why they should not be compelled to annul the contract granted the Blaine County Investment company, operators of the Little Lost Lake valley project.

The action was brought after an opinion of the attorney general declaring the commissioner of reclamation was without authority to give notice to the investment company that its contract was forfeited.

The contract was based on a report of the commissioner, George N. Carter, that the contract had been fulfilled "as nearly as humanly possible."

Settling a long action for the writ of mandamus declared the company had not fulfilled its contract in that it had not provided water promised the settlers when the project was formed in 1910.

M. H. Wood, manager of the project whose home was dynamited last Sunday night, was brought into the case along with several others who testified against the company.

The action brought in at least two hundred cases now pending while a great number have already been decided.

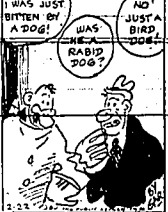

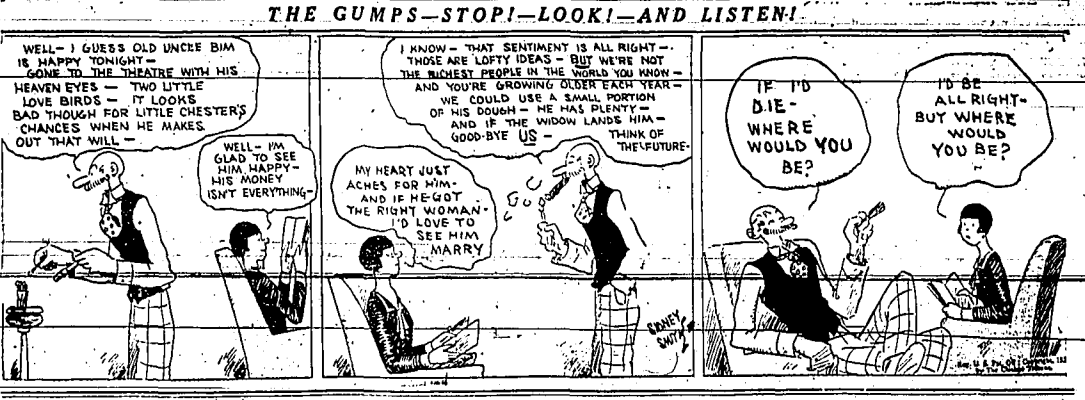
