HOOVER NOMINATES OWENS J. ROBERTS FOR HIGH TRIBUNAL. Leaders of Fight Against Judge Parker Welcome Executive's Choice for Vacancy in Supreme Court.

WASHINGTON, May 9 (AP) - Owen J. Roberts, of Philadelphia, who presided over the government's oil fraud cases, was proposed to the senate today by President Hoover for the supreme court in the place of the rejected Judge John J. Parker, North Carolina.

Welcomed by the leaders of the fight against Judge Parker, the senate, the motion that he be readily referred to the judiciary committee for its consideration before the proposition issue was raised against Mr. Roberts by Senator Sheppard, Democrat, Texas.

The reason pointed to a speech made by Mr. Roberts in 1922, in which he was denouncing the Eighteenth amendment and said "It is not mine" and announced his opposition.

Senator Reed, Republican, Pennsylvania, who heathily endorsed Mr. Roberts, in a speech today, immediately called the nominee on the telephone. He brought back word from Roberts that he had not heard the merits of prohibition in the 1922 speech but had confirmed his discussion to the lawyer's "academic question" of whether it was preferable to prohibit by statute or by constitutional amendment.

Without his judgment. Senator Sheppard laid out newspapermen he had been habitually informed that Mr. Roberts denied the speech and that he would withhold judgment.

Senator Reed was confident tonight that the prohibition issue was not involved and he predicted Roberts would be confirmed. Senator Sheppard, Democrat, Indiana, the Republican leader who conferred with the president on the issue, however, said he would confer today and endorsed him and predicted his confirmation.

Since then Mr. Roberts, with Allen Parsons, who is being prosecuted the secretary of the Teapot-Domest and the Hill naval reserve fiasco. In addition, he played a leading part in the criminal prosecutions of Albert B. Fall, former secretary of the interior, and Edward Tamm, and Harry F. Sinclair, who were given the oil leases by Fall.

POSSIBILITY OF NOISE CAUSING SUDDEN DEATH. GETS EXPERT ATTENTION. NEW YORK, May 9 (AP) - Noise can directly cause sudden death, the Acoustical Society of America was informed today.

This was the high point in a summary of the harm done by noise, presented by Dr. Shirley Wynne, New York City health commissioner. He disclosed researches of the latest scientific noise move, which seeks to take the guesswork out of the question whether noise is merely an annoyance or whether it is a good health.

Dr. Wynne said there was good reason for believing that the death of middle aged men are due to sudden loud noises.

AL CAPONE FACES TROUBLE IN MIAMI. City Officials Order Arrest of Chicago Outlaw Limited Ever Found Within Limits.

MIAMI, Fla., May 9 (AP) - Order of Miami city officials for the arrest of "Scarface" Al Capone when he is found within the city limits remained in effect tonight with the refusal of Federal Judge H. L. Hays to let the Chicago racketeer's attorney file for a temporary injunction forbidding his arrest without a warrant.

Judge Hays, last week, made permanent a temporary injunction restraining 20 Florida sheriffs from arresting Capone without a warrant, but he explained today that the injunction was issued because it applied to him as an interstate matter.

Not Present at Hearing. Capone was not present at the hearing, being represented by counsel.

CHINA'S PRESIDENT COMMANDS TO DOOPS. Chiang Kai-Shek Hastens to Suchow in Endeavor to Halt Advance on Nanking.

NANKING, May 9 (AP) - While 80,000 army were scouring several provinces of China, President Chiang Kai-Shek of the National government hastened to Suchow, Kiangsu province today to take command of the forces ordered to halt the advance of the northern alliance, which was marching on Nanking, China's capital.

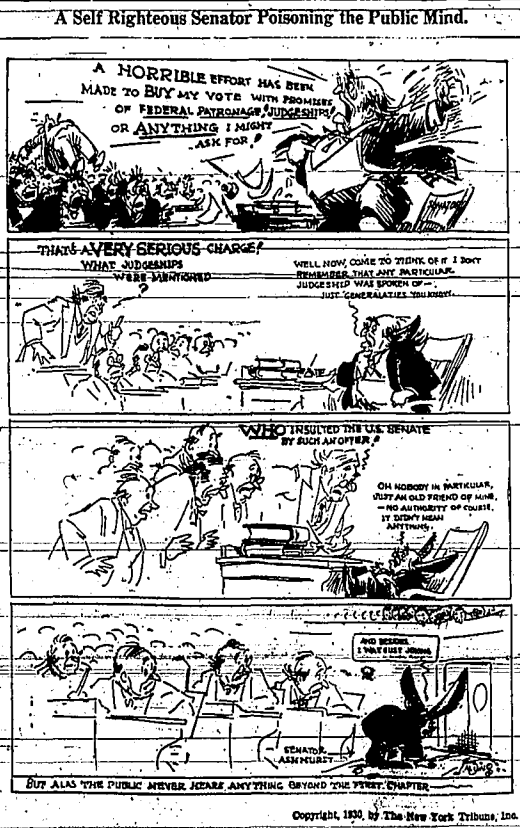

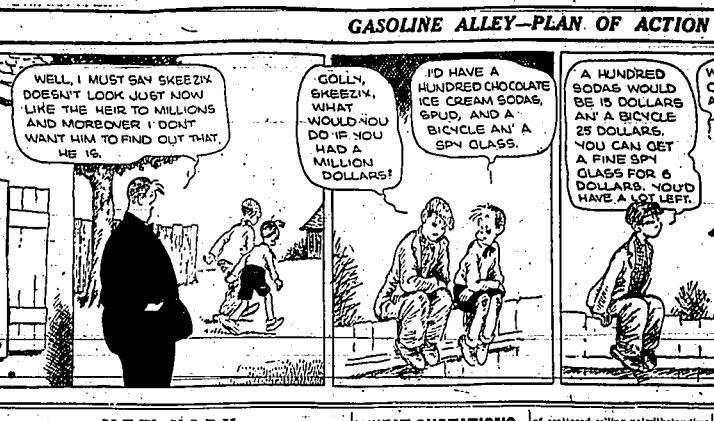

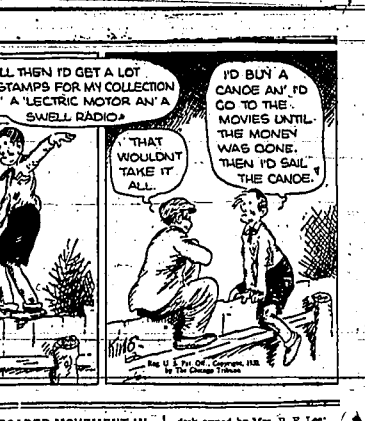
