Decline of Wheat Prices Just in Planting Season Slashes Surplus, Declares Bay State Statistician

Financial Expert Urges Farmers To Give Credit To Government Body For Keen Understanding of Economics of Agriculture

B ABSON PARK, Massachusetts, May 10—The smashing decline in wheat prices, coming as it did shortly after the farm hoard began tik swork, was hailed as proof of failure for the whole administration scheme of farm relief, My own opinion is that this price decline has greatly assisted rather than hindered the farm board in its plans. The fact of the matter is that the board probably prefers low prices until after the spring planting season is ever. Hence, instead of criticizing the board-107 childre-to-kopp, prices up-in-the-period, just hofore the planting season, let us give the members credit for a keen under-7
