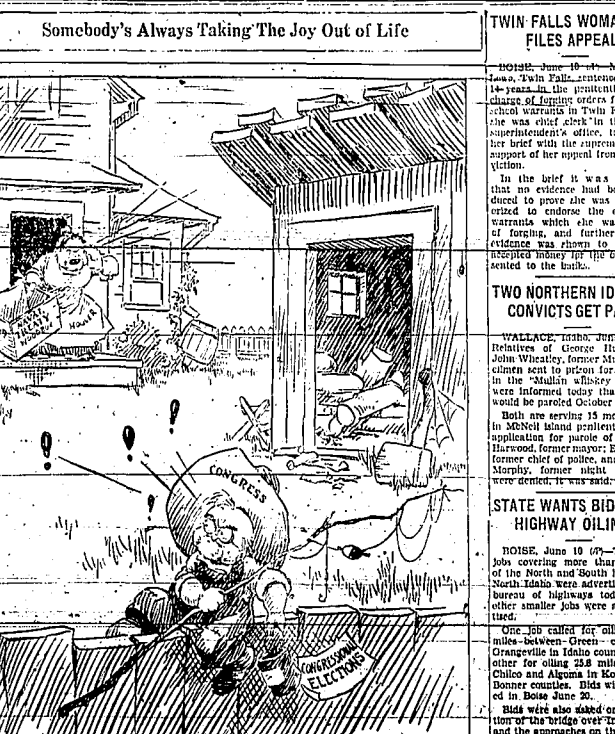

BANKS PUT BLAME FOR SCHOOL FUND LOSS ON OFFICIALS

Buyers of Assertedly Unauthorized Orders for Warrants Disclose Defense Lines at Hearing

County superintendents of public instruction and county auditors as well as school district trustees, are agents of rural school districts, and their failure to perform their respective constituent duties to prevent districts from receiving school funds disbursed improperly because of the failure of the banks to check this argument was advanced in district court here yesterday by attorneys for the banks. A number of Twin Falls county rural school districts are authorized to receive school funds alleged to have been disbursed on unauthorized orders.

Suits involve claims of \$71,000 from 21 rural school districts for approximately \$15,000, alleged to have been paid by bank trustees of a former employee in the office of the county superintendent of public instruction. The suits were filed in district court here in February, 1929.

Attacks Accountant's Report
Attorneys for one of the banks also attacked validity of an accountant's list of assertedly unauthorized orders which the district trustees seeking to recover, and asserted that one of the two orders on which suit was based is not based on a valid order issued in payment of a teacher's salary and paid to the teacher.

Council for the third bank school district claim and called for the district evidence which was presented at hearing before District Judge W. A. Babcock yesterday.

Hearing in the school district cases before Judge Babcock in district court here yesterday brought out the imposing array of legal talent. Frank L. Stephens, former attorney general as counsel for the Twin Falls Bank and Trust company; Walters, Parry and Thomas, attorneys for the National Bank and Trust company; W. Orr Chapman, attorney for the Twin Falls National bank, and others were present.

Judge Bothwell of counsel for the Twin Falls National bank stood on his denial of the district claim, and declined to offer any evidence after hearing testimony of the district witnesses. The witness included Harry O. Parsons, county auditor, who identified a warrant on the order treasurer's order which he reported to have been issued by officials of the Deep Creek school district. C. H. Hahn, county treasurer, testified that money had been paid on warrants taking \$600 out of Deep Creek district funds.

In addition to claim of question of the district by reason of official's asserted negligence, counsel for the bank that filed the district claim, districts' complaints, charge the districts are guilty of laches in that they failed to give the bank notice of the loss of funds or to prosecute this suit within a reasonable time after the loss occurred. By reason of this long acquiescence in the bank's adverse claim to the money it produced in the redemption of warrants it is asserted, the bank and attorney has changed and prejudiced so that it cannot now recover from the persons who sold the orders to the bank, sums equal to the amount paid by the bank for the orders.

County auditors, according to one line of the bank's defense, are not defense authorized, and are required to know the signatures of school district officials. The law determines whether school district orders for warrants are genuine or false. Auditors are authorized to draw warrants on funds standing to the credit of school districts in the county treasury and are required to return promptly the orders for warrants to the school district clerk.

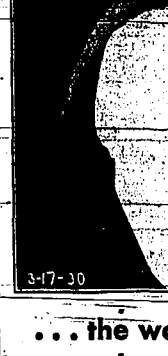

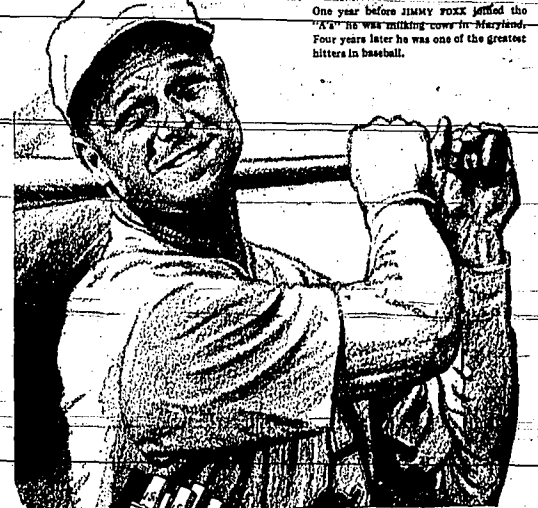

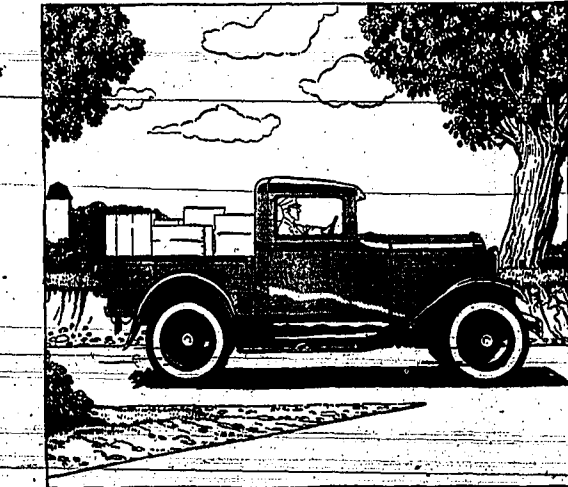
