Georgian Shoots 291 on 72 Holes At Hoylake Links

Victor Holds Two-Stroke Lead—Over Leo Diegel and MacDonald Smith in Hard-Fought Last Round

With Amateur Title Taken Last Month at St. Andrews, American Matches Former Feat of John Ball

HOYLAKE, England, June 20.—Bobby Jones, shooting 291 and holding a two-stroke lead over Leo Diegel and MacDonald Smith in hard-fought last round today won his third British open golf championship, crowning off one of the greatest battles of the golfing centuries.

Horton Smith and Fred Robson, veteran British "pro" golfers, matched the feat of the famous Hoylake amateur, John Ball, who 40 years ago won the British Amateur open title the same year. Ball was to Hoylake today, but did not brave the surging crowd of nearly 10,000 which was expected to witness the final round.

The Georgian takes the classic trophy to the United States for its ninth year in 1930 and will be applied another golf record by cutting 18 strokes from the Hoylake mark which was set by Walter Hagen here in 1924.

Today Bobby took the old trophy away to London where he will fight in a couple of charity matches and will sail for home next Saturday night.

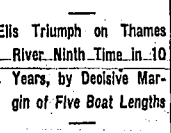

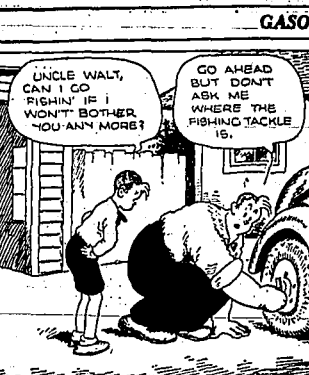

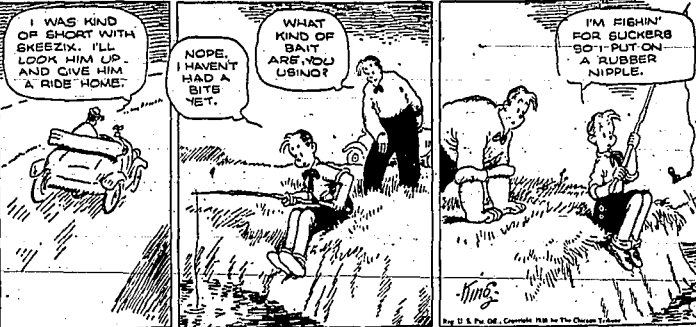
