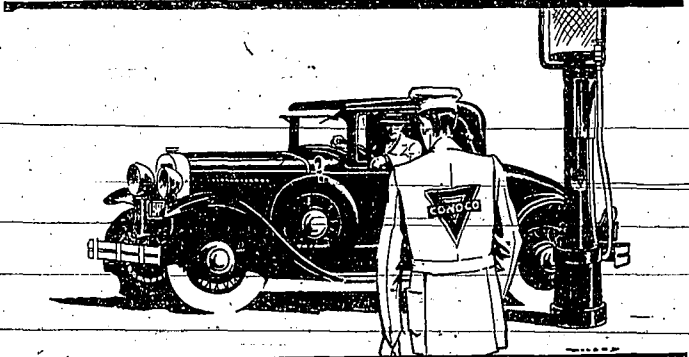

SCHOOLS FOR BRIGHT KIDS

New York has made some interesting experiments in giving special opportunities to gifted school children. A report covering those who placed in special opportunity classes in one particular grade school in the years 1922 to 1925 reveals these facts:

The high school record of the children has seemed to justify the extra care bestowed on them. The gifted children showed not only in their class work, general activities, attendance and health.

Yet there was a difficulty which is hardly always found in such cases. These brilliant youngsters averaged about two years less in age than their associates. Half of them said they were sorry they had entered high school so early, because they could not make friends with their classmates or take part in activities.

What is the answer? Grade pupils by age? Keep mothers satisfied? Give them special classes all the way through, from kindergarten through university, letting the slow compete with the slow and the bright with their own peers?

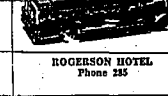

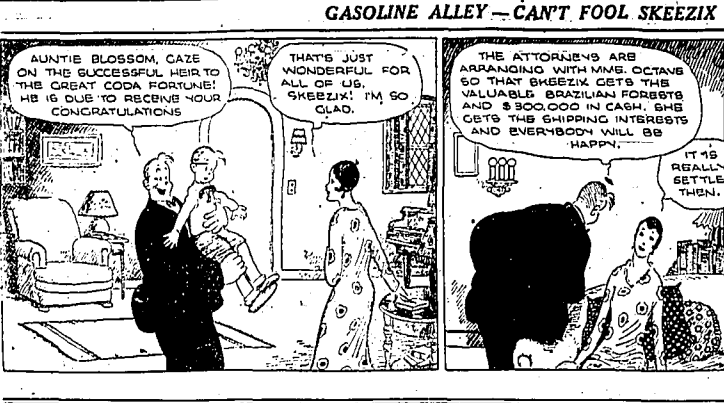
