COUNCIL FAVORS CONTINUED WORK ON WATER LINE

Uninterrupted Laying of Iron Pipe to Complete Task This Year Hinges On Ability to Borrow

Sentiment expressed by Twin Falls council members at a regular meeting last evening indicated that the city will borrow some \$20,000 to complete a continuing program of replacement of wood with iron pipe throughout the municipal water distribution system, project which was authorized last year.

Calling for an expression by fellow members of the council, T. Sanderson, commissioner of street and waterworks, last evening asked whether, in their judgment, the replacement program should be continued at the present rate of progress to completion late next November, or whether it should be suspended until additional revenues should be forthcoming from collection of monthly water service charges.

There has been \$12,000 worth of iron pipe, approximately 18,000 feet of iron pipe, leaving 14,000 feet of iron pipe to be laid to complete the replacement throughout the system. The rate of progress has exceeded expectations, the commissioner said, and funds for this project are depleted. He recalled that the city attorney had advised that in an emergency measure the city might borrow money to carry on the program, pledging waterworks property as security for the loan.

Breaks Show Decline
With the extension of iron pipe lines there has been marked reduction in the number of breaks occurring, Mr. Sanderson said. During the year he said, 12 breaks occurred, involving an expense of not less than \$600. During the first two weeks of this month he added, only four breaks have occurred.

"Some of the worst places have been gotten over already," Mr. Sanderson said. "The question is whether it is safe to stop now."

He stated his own conviction that it would be the "best" plan to borrow money and complete the replacement program as rapidly as possible.

Other members of the council suggested a moral responsibility to provide employment where it was possible.

During the months of May and June, the records showed, expenditures for labor and materials in the water pipe replacement program totaled \$21,000.

Council received a report last evening from the waterworks department showing collection of \$5664 for water service in May with June accounts totaling \$7084 collectible this month.

H. D. Read, police magistrate, reported collection of \$300 in fines and costs during June.

The street sprinkling assessment roll for 1930 totaling \$10,500, as submitted by Commissioner Sanderson, was received by the council last evening, and August 12 was set as the time for receiving protests against adoption. Total assessment showed a reduction of \$240.72 over last year's \$10,500 roll.

Applications for five building permits involving \$2000 total expenditures were received and granted by the council last evening, subject to the building inspector's approval.

Charles H. Davis applied for permit to construct a \$5000 dwelling house in Blue Lakes addition. Byron J. Wood, manager of the Circle lunch, asked for permit to construct a new front and make other improvements to cost \$1000 in the building on Main avenue north lately occupied by the Brunawick cigar store. E. K. Evans applied for permit to build a service station with gas tanks and pump at the corner of Main avenue and Seventh street south, to cost \$300. J. F. Arrington applied for permit for construction of six cabins, each 9 by 12 feet, on Third avenue south, to cost \$1500. E. D. Dunning, 623 Third avenue east, applied for permit to build a \$700 kitchen, bath and porch at his residence.

Council authorized payment of bills totaling \$3225, together with \$10216 interest on account of bonds of three street paving districts. Bills included \$2253 against the general fund; \$425 for street sprinkling; and \$846 for the municipal band.

Interment will be held at the grave of a brother whose death occurred some years ago following a brief illness from appendicitis.

Lyle Wayne met death by electrocution when the electric light on a long wire dropped into the tub in which he was bathing at the family residence Saturday afternoon.

He is survived by his parents and his two-year-old brother, Allan Dale, who crawled out of the tub shortly before it became charged with electricity.
