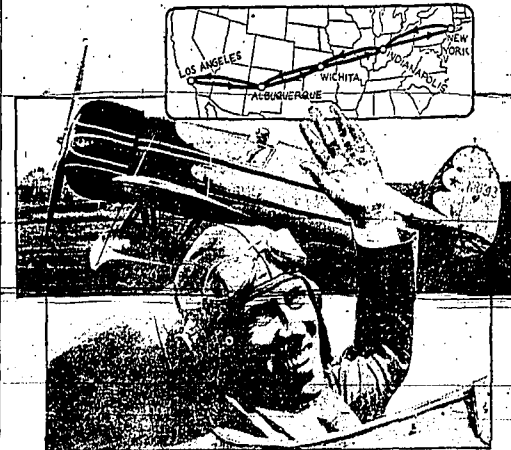

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, July 15—Members of the United States supreme court do not escape official duties during their four months' summer vacation...

(Continued from Page One) party with having completed a decade of successful financial management in the face of world-wide depression and said the administration of President Hoover and the seventy-first congress had been confronted with serious economic problems arising from this depression and due to no fault of their own.

"He added the president had done all that was humanly possible to relieve the situation but a worldwide force of economic readjustment cannot altogether be arrested in a short time."

In spite of this, he said, there was a surplus of \$19,000,000 in the treasury at the end of the year, the public debt had been reduced \$700,000,000, taxes lowered \$100,000,000 and the government found itself able to create without raising taxes in an extensive public works program as a measure of relief.

The Republican leader said that congress was "grossly extravagant" and added in the last year appropriations had been \$844,000,000 less than budget estimates. During the last regular session, he said, congress had cut \$23,000,000 from President Hoover's budget recommendations for an outlay of \$4,807,553,440.

16 PERSONS RECEIVE INJURY IN COLLISION

NEW YORK, July 15 (AP)—Sixteen persons were hurt, three seriously in a rear-end collision between two crowded elevated trains at the Chambers street station of the Sixth Avenue "L" late today. The accident threw hundreds of home-bound passengers into a state bordering on panic.

The crash occurred after a north-bound express train, pulling out of the station stalled at a block. A moment later a local train proceeding in the same direction, struck it, smashing the rear platform of the

last car and throwing the car partly off the rails.

Those seriously hurt were Joseph D'Alagni, 54, possible skull fracture; Thomas Carver, crushed back; William A. Custer, the motorman of the local train, fractured arm.

All the others hurt were struck by flying glass or bruised by the impact of the trains.

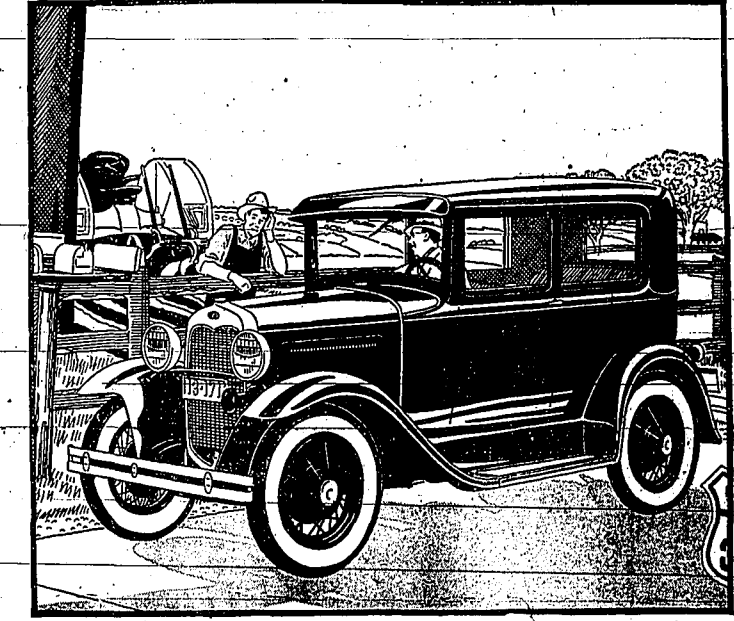

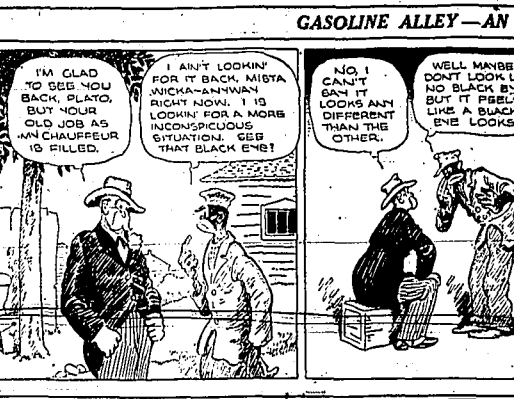

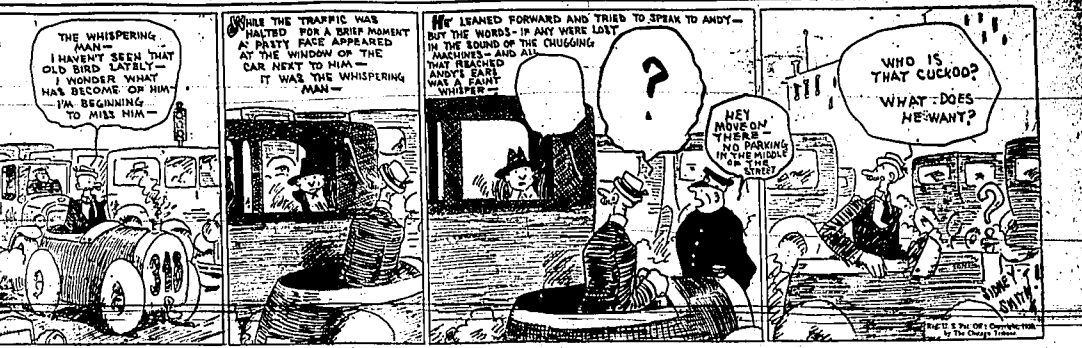
