German Cabinet Declares Financial Program In Operation

STATUTE CALLS FOR TAX ON INCOMES OF \$2000 AND GREATER

With President von Hindenburg's Authorization Government Over-Rides Parliamentary Opposition

(By The Associated Press)
BERLIN, July 16.—By the desperate measure of over-riding parliamentary opposition the cabinet tonight with President von Hindenburg's authorization under Article 48 of the constitution declared its hotly contested financial program a law.

The action created a situation making the law, present Reichstag and Reichstag body will be informed officially of the cabinet's decision in the Reichstag. The Reichstag then will be called tomorrow, if unwilling passively to consent to the measure, or to protest against the application of Article 48.

Since the government, on first indication of a majority against it in the Reichstag, doubtfully will dissolve the Reichstag, observers here said further opposition to Finance Minister Dietrich's plan would be highly improbable.

In circles close to Chancellor Brüning, it is believed that tonight's action would be forestalled, if necessary, but in view of important bills still pending, among them relief programs for farmers and the eastern provinces, every effort would be made to bring the Reichstag session.

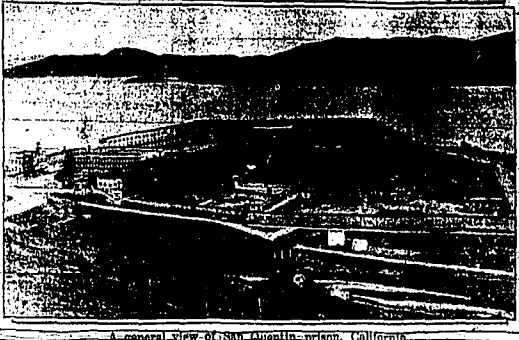

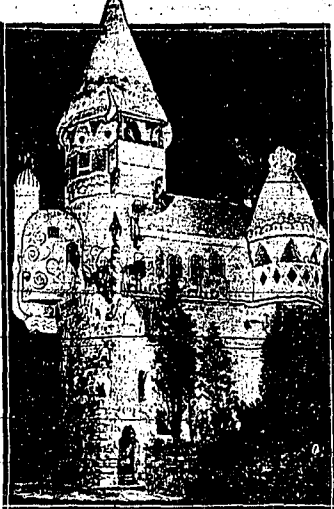

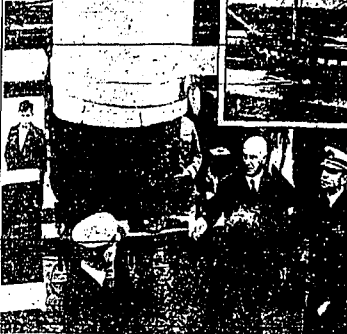
