### LABOR SUPPLY IN IDAHO AND UTAH EXCEEDS DEMAND

Monthly Report of Government Employment Service Shows Slightly Improved Conditions During Month

(By The Associated Press) DENVER, July 17.—The supply of skilled and unskilled labor in Idaho and Utah is reported to exceed demand in the month of July, according to a report of the United States department of labor, released today.

The report, of bi-monthly reports, shows that in Idaho and Utah there is a large surplus of unskilled labor in the Idaho district, the report said, but that in Utah the surplus is being absorbed during July by harvesting of various crops.

The lumber companies, especially in north Idaho, further curtailed their operations in the last month, but the harvesting of several fruit and vegetable canning factories offered considerable employment to both men and women. Although little relief was in sight at the first of the month, factories resuming operations before the end of July were expected to employ many hundreds.

**Mining Slow**  
Very little metal mining development work was reported during June and July, especially in the southern part of the state. Several metal mines resumed operations in the Idaho district, but the Highway building increased somewhat, but railroad work slowed up during the month.

Considerable improvement was noted in the Boise and Pocatello districts, in particular in employment showing considerable improvement. Railroad work jumped at Pocatello, but other lines of employment showed considerable improvement.

Both unskilled and skilled labor exceeded the demand in Idaho, but conditions were improved over the previous month. Sugar beet thinning and weeding was completed, and many men quit work, and the early harvesting of several crops offered considerable relief to the idle.

**Building Work**  
The usual summer schedules continued in the state's coal mines, but metal mining was slow. Highway construction and other building activities showed considerable improvement over the month, and in general conditions were more favorable.

In the Ogden district some improvement was noted in several industries. Factories operated on a full and satisfactory basis, and work was broken out of jobs by the completion of sugar beet thinning and weeding, more men absorbed by harvesting of various crops. Ginning factories resuming operations in the area, and the new work to many men and women now idle.

In the Salt Lake City section, canning factories and other industries, but metal mining was slow. Highway construction and other building activities showed considerable improvement over the month, and in general conditions were more favorable.

**GROUP STUDIES EFFECTS OF TRUCKS ON MARKETS**

Tradition has it that natives used to lead an old nag with a lantern tied around its neck up and down the shore to deceive ships and lure them on treacherous shoals nearby. Many fishermen, the story goes, met disaster at the tale.

Although modern inhabitants scoff at this tale, old-timers insist this was the way Nags-head got its name.

### SCHOOL GIVES TRAINING FOR VILLAGE PHYSICIANS

NEW ORLEANS, July 17 (AP)—The school of medicine at Tulane University is now in its second year of operation. It is to be opened next fall for advanced students.

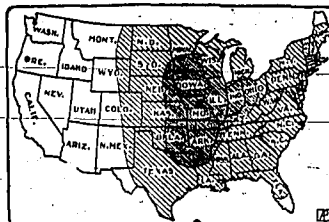

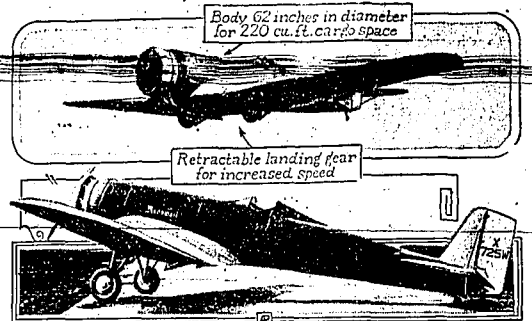
# Stream Lines Of New Air Mail Plane Give Greater Speed

## Design Of Low-Wing Monoplane Cuts Down On Wind Resistance

Retractable Landing Gear Adds Approximately 27 Miles Per Hour to Celerity of Newly-Designed Ship

BEATLE, July 17—Designed to hold 220 pounds, or 42 per cent of its own weight, through the air faster than previous transport ships, a new low-wing monoplane has been placed in operation on the San Francisco-Chicago air mail route. The new plane, named the Monomail, has a cargo space of 220 cubic feet in a fuselage five feet in diameter. The machine is purely a cargo plane, with the pilot in an open cockpit. A second plane of similar design, to be placed in service soon, will have space for 41 or 42 passengers and 100 to 110 pounds of cargo. The Monomail flies with its landing gear partly folded back into the wing. A position of the wheels extends down so in event of a forced landing there would be slight danger of crushing.

Boeing engineers say the retracting wheels, by reducing resistance, add approximately 27 miles an hour to the ship's speed. On the first hop between San Francisco and Salt Lake City, with a mail load of 800 pounds, the plane cruised at 142 miles an hour, 34 miles an hour faster than the rated cruising speed of cargo planes used regularly on the route. The rated top speed is 148 miles an hour. The Monomail is all-metal with a 110-horsepower motor. It has a 100-mile cruising radius, can climb 800 feet a minute to a service ceiling of 14,000 feet and an absolute ceiling of 16,000 feet. Its rated landing speed is 50 miles an hour.

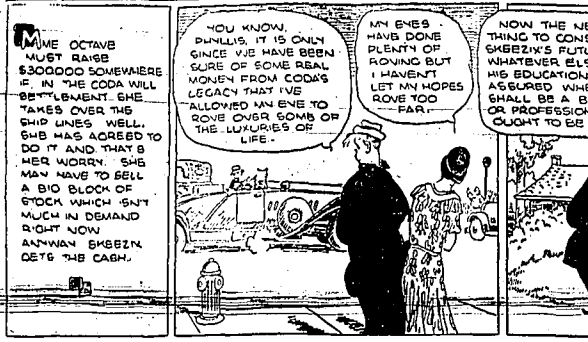

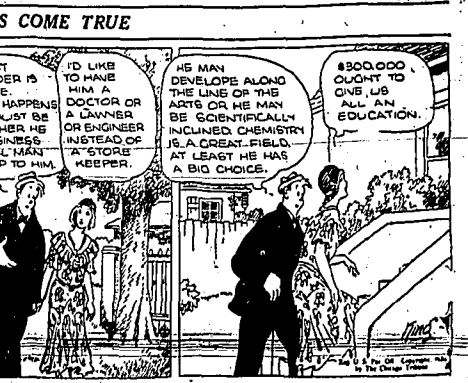

### STATE RULES UPON POTATO SHIPMENTS

Wegvil Certificates Must Accompany All Exports Into Several States

Warning that shippers of potatoes into the states of Arizona, California, Nevada, Montana, New Mexico and that part of Oregon west of Baker must accompany the shipment with a Wegvil certificate, has been received here by Edgar V. Gipson, district deputy inspector, from the state department of agriculture. The warning notice is signed by John B. Welch, commissioner of agriculture, and M. L. Dean, director of the bureau of plant industry.

The warning is given, it is stated, in order that shippers may have ample notice of requirements and regulations regarding Wegvil certificates. The following rules are included among necessary conditions connected with shipments:

"Inspectors to be notified by shipper in advance of loading operation in order that they can examine cars before loading is commenced. Cars must be clean and free from alfalfa hay, other hay or cereal straw. Inspectors should examine bunkers and all space beneath false floor tracks and require all cars to be swept clean.

"Potatoes must be passed over a screen in such a manner as to allow all stock to come in contact with the screen and to permit the removal of all alfalfa stems, straw or other grass or grass stems, immediately prior to loading and placed into new or fresh, clean, laundered, second hand cars. Receiving must be done in cellar, or warehouse located on, or within 300 feet of railroad right of way.

"The term 'immediately' shall mean potatoes to be run over screen line or clean container a and placed directly into car. A small number of sacks may be screened and placed on a cleared portion of the space of a recognized Wegvil room entirely separate from any other stock for a period of not to exceed four hours. This privilege shall be optional with the inspector in charge. Extended storage in the Wegvil room may be granted by the inspector in charge."
