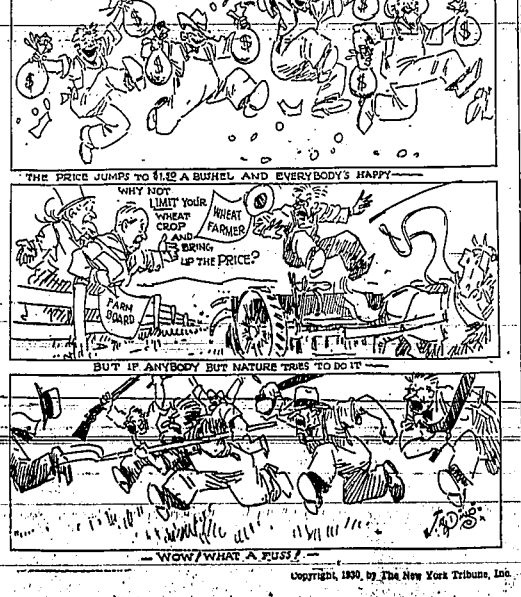

COUNCIL AT BUHL LOWERS TAX LEVY

BUHL, July 10 (Special to The News)—Buhl city council decided upon a reduction of 9.5 mills in city taxes at its regular meeting Tuesday evening. The decrease was made in view of the fact that it was necessary to raise the amount for interest on various bond issues, members of the council stated.

The council also decided upon a collection from water rentals, payable in advance, of \$1000 last year, made possible part of the reduction.

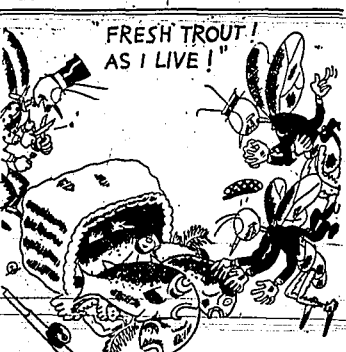

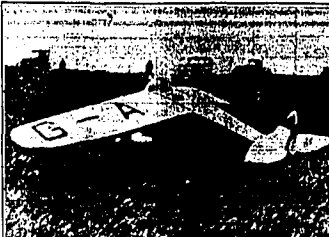
