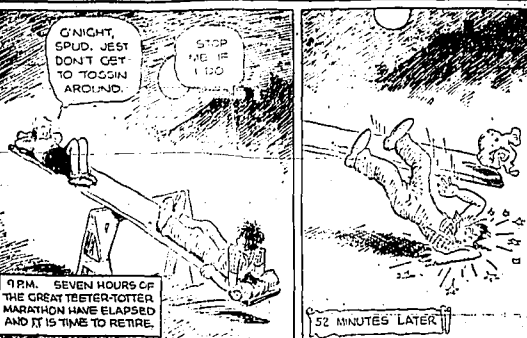

CONGRESSMAN TELLS RECORD OF PARTY'S PLEDGES FULFILLED

No Republican Need Apologize for Any Failure of Administration of Congress, Declares Addison T. Smith

There is no occasion for any Republican to apologize for any failure on the part of the Republican administration, says Congressman Addison T. Smith today at a public meeting at the University of Idaho, in his address to the Republican convention here yesterday.

The congressman pointed out in detail measures adopted to fulfill pledges for farm relief and unemployment and to move the unemployment problem. He said in part: "I am most appreciative of this opportunity to look into the faces of the leaders of the Republican party in Twin Falls county. It has been a month honored by the people of this county and state, and at each succeeding election have been the most loyal supporters of which I am most deeply grateful. "You have assembled today in accordance with the laws of our state as the chosen representatives of the Republican of this county to nominate a platform of principles and to select delegates to the state convention, who in turn will nominate federal and state officers and elect a president in the general election in November.

A Record of Stewardship

"In a democracy like ours, a certain portion of the people must assume personal responsibility for the conduct of the government. Fortunately it is true that a large majority take but little interest in governmental affairs and only about 50 per cent of those who are eligible to vote exercise the right of franchise.

The service you are performing must be voluntary and without expense. You are here, many say, perhaps at considerable sacrifice, because of your interest in the good of the country and your confidence can only be attained by the Republican party. Your loyalty to that party and your pride in its achievements impels you to stand in every way possible to maintain its supremacy.

For over 10 years the Republican party has been in control of governmental affairs in state and nation, and it is not proper that it should be prepared to give an account of our stewardship. "Twelve months ago our present chief executive took over the affairs of government, when he presented his message to congress and the members of the legislative and executive branches of the government.

The outstanding issue was the campaign of two years ago legislative relief for agriculture, and this program was given immediate consideration by President Hoover by calling congress in special session.

The farm marketing bill was enacted and an appropriation of \$300,000,000 was authorized to carry it into effect. "The tariff was revised with special reference to benefits which would accrue to those engaged in agricultural pursuits. The duty on the products of the farm and range were materially increased so as to insure the home market to producers.

"President Hoover has been aided by his visits to the South American countries, to establish more friendly relations than have existed in the past between our country and the South American republics. There have been three prior to his inauguration has been in visits from the present president of three South American countries, which have created a better understanding and will cement the friendship of these nations as our own.

"The important resolution in Haiti was presented by the present president of the appointment of a commission to visit Haiti and confer with the Haitian government on the two factors. As a result an understanding has been reached which will make it possible for our military forces there to be completely withdrawn.

"The visit to this country of Ramsey MacDonald, premier of Great Britain, resulted in authority being given by congress to the president to attend a commission to attend the armament conference in London which was participated in by other nations. As a result a treaty was formulated and was adopted by the United States senate a few weeks ago.

History shows that there are cycles of business depression and unemployment and this situation is not confined to our country alone but is world-wide. It is natural for the administration in power to be held responsible for the present condition, but there is every indication that there is an upward tendency in business affairs and that under the leadership of the laws enacted by the present congress normal conditions will prevail in the near future."
