



### NEVADA OFFICIALS FAVOR COMPLETION OF THROUGH ROUTE

County Commissioners and Representatives of Towns Unite to Push Construction of Highway Number 93

(Special to The News) EDY, Sept. 9—Three meetings, attended by 200 persons, closing with a banquet here last night, started a vigorous and harmonious campaign for the completion of the state highway and to urge the effort of the state of Nevada.

In the morning the county commissioners of all the counties along the route met and worked out an agreeable program looking toward construction of the highway to Las Vegas. In the afternoon there was a general meeting of representatives of all the counties and towns along the route to make a general declaration on the exact location and the method of procedure to be pursued. Complete understanding was reached in this respect, and the resolution laid for completion of highway.

As night a booster banquet was given to visitors by the commercial organization of Edy and the commercial organization of White Pine county, of which Edy is the county seat. There were numerous talks in favor of the highway.

W. M. Durkin, Carson, Clipp, state highway engineer, is making a survey of the line on public lands along the proposed route. In order that steps may be taken to secure federal funds, approved by under the Ogden act, the procedure to be followed by the county or state will take about two months to complete this survey.

There are several sections of public lands through which the highway will pass, and the state of Nevada is united in favor of the speedy construction of the route as well for its completion within a reasonable time. It is believed there are no highway districts to be consulted in Nevada where the county commissioners have charge of county road work.

It opened every rationing station, and Director Avery and a staff consisting of 10,000 persons are receiving the rationing daily.
