Director of Harvard Observatory Proposes Idea Aimed to Clear Mysteries

Celestial Organization Surrounding Solar System Appears in Cloud Divisions



CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Sept. 18.—Probabilities that elsewhere in space there are stellar universes like ours are increased by a new interpretation at Harvard of the shape of the Milky Way.

The idea is proposed by Dr. Harlow Shapley, director of Harvard observatory. It promises to help clear up a mystery that has puzzled astronomers. This mystery is the shape of our galaxy.

It is believed that the Milky Way is a collection of stars in a spiral form. The spiral arms are made up of stars. The center of the galaxy is a dense cloud of stars.

Dr. Shapley's theory is based on the study of the spiral arms. He believes that the spiral arms are made up of stars that are arranged in a regular pattern. This pattern is similar to the pattern of stars in other galaxies.

The study of the spiral arms has led to the discovery of many new stars. These stars are called "variable stars" because their brightness changes over time.

Dr. Shapley's theory is a new one. It is based on the study of the spiral arms and the discovery of variable stars. It is a theory that is still being tested.

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COURT DISSOLVES DECED CITIZENS' ROAD INJUNCTION

Dist. Judge Doran H. Sulphren Rules Complaints Contained in Papers to Be Irrelevant to Issue

(Special to The News)

HURLEY, Sept. 18.—C. W. Thomas, attorney for the Durley highway district, has received notification from District Judge Doran H. Sulphren, Gooding, that the temporary injunction granted in the action

between the government, the commissioner of public works and commissioners of the Durley highway district seeking to prevent the re-entrance of a portion of United States highway number 20 to run through Hurley, rather than Declo, will be dissolved.

In dissolving this temporary injunction, Judge Sulphren granted defendant's motion to strike paragraphs 4 and 5 of plaintiff's complaint relating to the bonded indebtedness of the Durley highway district and the outstanding bonds being held against the property of Declo residents. The motion contended that matters to be irrelevant and immaterial and that they had no bearing upon the issue attempted to be made in the complaint. Paragraph 21 had also been struck under the court's ruling, this paragraph dealing with the property of the defendant.

The defendant was charged with having acted arbitrarily and capriciously and without regard to the rights of property owners owning property abutting on and adjacent to the old state highway.

In asking that the portion of the complaint be stricken, the defendant contended that the same was sham and irrelevant in that the allegations contained in said para-

graphs should be stricken. The defendant contended that no abuse of discretion on the part of the defendant had been alleged, and that the defendant was not liable for the alleged injury.

The defendant's motion was granted by Judge Sulphren, and the temporary injunction was dissolved.

CORNER IN TUBERS BRINGS PROTEST FROM OREGON MAN

State Chamber Secretary Receives Appeal to Growers To Resist Temptation to Play Part in Monopoly

A New York man's declaration of purpose to buy all of Idaho's potato crop this year, has brought J. P. Parsons, secretary of the Idaho State Chamber of Commerce, a protest from a Portland, Oregon, man, the appeals to Idaho growers to resist temptation to take any part in cornering the Idaho market.

The Oregon man's protest, which has been made public by the state chamber secretary, is as follows: "Mr. L. P. Parsons, Secretary, Chamber of Commerce, Boise, Idaho:

"I read that a certain E. D. Gleason is seeking to buy the Idaho potato crop, some 20,000 carloads. Some 2,000,000 families may well ask—why? "If the good God has blessed your state with an abundant harvest, where Central and Eastern states have suffered from one of the worst droughts in the history of our country, why should Idaho seek to profit by this misfortune? "The potato is the staple vegetable of this poor of our great eastern states; and this occupies from the East is seeking to corner the market, make his own price, and thereby to rob the poor of their money, and to deprive their children of those countless benefits to health which the potato is to them.

"Will the Idaho farmer be a party to this crying injustice? "I beg of you all, you farmers of Idaho, not to sell your God-given crops to any one man, or to any group of men, that are seeking to perpetrate this colossal injustice. Sell your potatoes as you have in the past, to different buyers representing the 'free trade'.

"Money isn't everything. Resist the temptation. Do to others as you would be done by. Then you may anticipate that the blessing of God

NORTH SPEAKS UPON FAMOUS DOCUMENT

Twin Falls' Lawyer Traces Conflict of Two Ideals Leading to Civil War

"The Civil war was fought and won by Alexander Hamilton, John Marshall and Daniel Webster men whose names are still remembered."

Charles A. North, Twin Falls attorney, today told the Twin Falls Kiwanis club in its weekly luncheon yesterday speaking on the Constitution of the United States in Constitution Day observance.

Mr. North traced the development of government from the earliest times to the adoption of the Constitution, touching on the conceptions of primary purpose of government, the rights of the individual and the other the promotion of order.

After Henry had been elected, Mr. North said, Hamilton stood at the great exponent of a strong central government, while Thomas Jefferson, touching on the constitution, liberty extension of local self government. With Jefferson's theory was a passion. Hamilton believed in force and action. Washington, who recognized the danger of house on one hand and of too much centralization on the other stood between them and sought to keep what was best in the theories of Jefferson and Hamilton.
