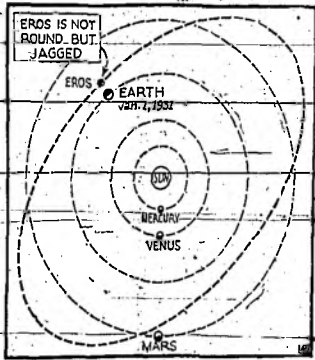
Astronomers Await Approach of Eccentric Planet, Eros

17-MILE-WIDE BIT OF ROCK WHIRLS IN SPACE NEAR EARTH

Elliptical Orbit Features Midget Body Claiming Attention of Sky Observers

SOLAR SYSTEM MEMBER REVOLVES IN 634 DAYS

Outside of Moon, Tiny Celestial Body Often Becomes Nearest Neighbor



The midget planet Eros will be about 16,000,000 miles from the earth late in January next year. Its orbit, as shown in sketch, is more elliptical than those of other planets.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15—An irregular bit of rock, some 17 miles in diameter, and named after the god of love, soon will occupy a position of astronomical importance throughout the world.

Hard on the heels of the discovery of a new member of Father Sol's family—Pluto discovery of a new member to turn their gaze on an older brother—Eros, one of the hundreds of tiny planets, on its next approach to the earth January 29 and 31 next year.

Eros, which was given a masculine name, astronomers say, because of its eccentricity of the orbit (elliptic name being the name of minor planets), was one of the discoveries which altered the astronomical world in closing days of the 19th century.

Remains Unique
AND it has remained one of the most unique members of the solar system because, outside of the moon, it is at times the earth's nearest neighbor in the skies.

Eros' period of revolution is 643 days. Its next apparition will be the best for astronomical measurement and observation until 1973.

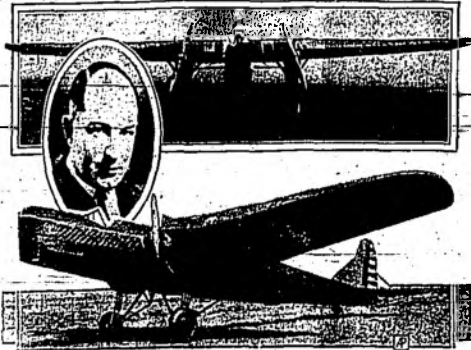

Army Tests "Flying Wing" Built For Military Observation

Unique Monoplane, Designed for Aerial Warfare, Undergoes Trial

Speedy Craft with Disappearing-Landing Gear and Long, Narrow Fuselage - Looks as Revolutionary Plane

DAYTON, Ohio, Oct. 15.—A new variety of the air—a Fokker of unusual design—will remain an engine until rigid army tests here are finished.

Neither the builders nor the war department has divulged the ability of the craft, though through the appearance of it at Dayton, New Jersey, Washington, and Dayton, army observers have said it will prove revolutionary in aerial war tactics and strategy.

The ship is precisely a flying wing—in flight merely a single full cantilever wing, plus a long narrow

fuselage, and two whirling propellers.

Its twin motors are barely perceptible bulges streamed into the leading edge of the wing. No landing gear is apparent, for in flight it draws up into the engine fairing that becomes part of the wing.

The plane is designed for use far behind enemy lines for day or night observation, photographic missions, ground strafing, and light bombing. The crew will comprise a pilot, observer, and a radio man.

Added to its protection of speed, which has been estimated by engineers, pending army tests, to be from 130 to 175 miles an hour. The machine will have two machines gun

covering attacks from ahead, astern, above and below.

The craft is the product of plans being developed for two years between the war department and engineers of Anthony H. G. Fokker, Dutch inventor and builder of Germany's famous fighting planes.

Development was finished more than a year ago after a mimic air corps war in Ohio, where military experts found a need for a fast long-range reconnaissance plane.

The monoplane is 65 feet from tip to wing tip, and 47 feet from nose to tail. The nose extends 13 feet ahead of the wing, with a cockpit in the extreme front for photographer and the pilot's seat behind.

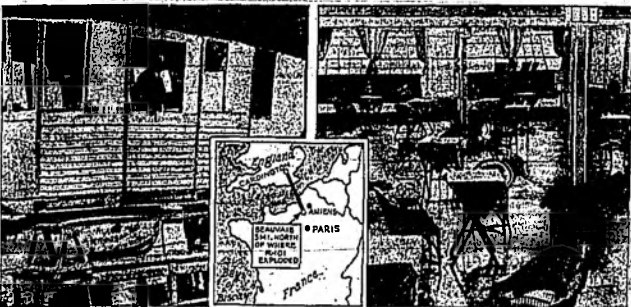
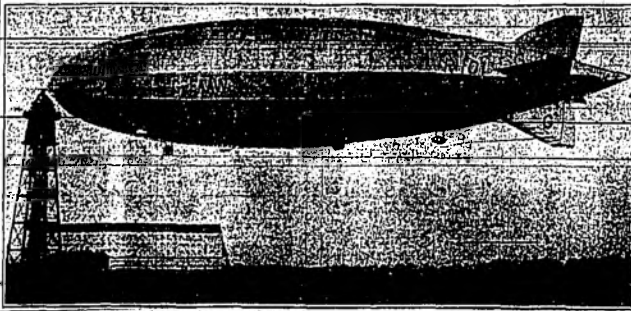
