## LABOR FEDERATION MOVES TO REMEDY UNEMPLOYMENT ILL

Plan Calls For Cooperative  
Participation of Public  
and Private Groups With  
President Hoover at Helm

(By The Associated Press)

**BOSTON,** Oct. 16.—A comprehensive plan of unemployment relief action which embraced provisions for the cooperative participation of public and private groups to be headed by President Hoover was adopted here today by the annual convention of the American Federation of Labor.

The convention referred to the Federation executive council, the entire unemployment insurance program and other legislation dealing with the subject.

The resolutions committee indicated which specific actions clearly indicated the best methods of alleviating unemployment distress in this manner.

The unemployment relief program provided for the appointment of a national committee of governors of all states, mayors and other similar officers of cities and towns and by the state and local labor bureaus to work with the federal and state governments in their immediate recommendations in their respective areas to the means of minimizing unemployment.

The procedure would be carried to the territories of Alaska and Canada by the unions.

"It has been accomplished with a deal of ease," he added.

**EAGLE DIES OF  
INJURY IN BATTLE**

Leader of Pack of Ruthless  
Robbers and Killers Pays  
With Life in Missouri

**SPRINGFIELD,** Mo., Oct. 15 (AP)—The Wolf of the West, Jake Feagle, is dead.

This modern bad man, the leader of a pack of ruthless robbers and killers who shot their way through the West and postoffice holdups in the West and Middle West, died at 2:35 a.m. today after a long and agonizing abdominal wound inflicted Tuesday when Feagle was shot as he was surprised by federal and state police at his hideout in the tiny town of Branson, Missouri, a little Ozark mountain town, caused his death.

With his passing, federal agents said, the first major criminal organization to claim a gain for their party, the Feagle Associates, were arrested.

Feagle, 36, was a desperado who had been a henchman of Al Capone, the latter having been hiding in the Tracy, California, postoffice robbery.

## GERMAN POLITICAL SITUATION GROWS WORSE EACH HOUR

Metal Workers' Union Calls  
126,000 Men From Tasks  
In Protest Against Leg-  
islature's New Program

(By The Associated Press)  
**BERLIN,** Oct. 15 (AP)—Confusion and disorder reigned in an already muddled political situation today when the German reichstag and Prussian diet held stormy sessions and the metal workers' union successfully called 126,000 workers from their jobs.

Paul Loebe was re-elected president by the reichstag, but violent clashes on the floor preceded his election. Hitler had adjourned his chair when the Nazis began obstructing tactics which if continued in the weeks to come would make a coalition cabinet impossible. President Loebe, who has served nine years in that office, was elected by 209 against Dr. Dietrich Eckart, German people's party candidate.

Election of Frank Stoeber, National Socialist, as first vice president of the diet was also secured by the first vote of the session. The Faculties claimed a gain for their party.

Die Feuerblume.

The diet session was tumultuous. The Faculties and Communists rejected the budget, while the Nazis supported any tax work. Even the proposed vote on non-confidence against the government had to go to a second vote because of a tie.

BOISE, Oct. 15 (AP)—Mrs. H. H. Bickford, 70, mother of Republican state chairman, died at her home in Pendleton, Oregon, to send the body back to Idaho.

## COMMISSION FINDS TASK TREMENDOUS

Investigators Abandon Hope  
For Announcement Before

**WASHINGTON,** Oct. 15 (AP)—An announcement that Congress take immediate steps to build an addition to the Post Office federal building was made yesterday by Chairman Wickerter of the Senate committee on appropriations which three members were unable to attend.

It is more than likely the test will show maladjustment of your own lights. When your own lights are in proper focus can be depended upon to light up at least the edge of your own side of the road, in opposition to the most blinding lights on the highway.

With the establishment of light testing stations in most communities, there is no excuse for defective lights.

Ever present measure and frequent serious consequences of defective lights would seem to furnish sufficient motive for the use of the light testing service for every automobile driver.

Experience, though, indicates that man must assume further elements of responsibility in many cases, and the work that Idaho's Department of Law Enforcement and State Traffic Officers are performing in this regard is about the most important of their many functions. In it they are deserving of all cooperation and support.

# Astronomers Await Approach of Eccentric Planet, Eros

**17-MILE-WIDE BIT  
OF ROCK WHIRLS IN  
SPACE NEAR EARTH**

**Elliptical Orbit Features  
Midget Body Claiming  
Attention of Sky  
Observers**



NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—  
An irregular bit of rock, some 17 miles in diameter, and named after the god of love, soon will occupy a position of astronomers throughout the world.

Hard on the heels of the discovery of a new member of Father Sol's family—Pluto—discovery of a new member to turn their glasses on an older but equally interesting object, hundreds of baby planets, on near the earth to the January 20 and 31st next year.

Eros, which has given a massive new name, astronomers say, because the eccentricity of its orbit (from the Latin name being the rule among planets) is greater than that of any other which altered the astronomical world in fifteen days of the 19th century.

Remains Unique  
And it has remained one of the most unique members of the solar system because, outside of the moon, it is the only celestial body

neighbor in the skies.

This irregular bit of rock will be a mere 16,200,000 miles distant in 1931—its distance may be measured with great precision, and the distance of the sun as well as the distance of the earth from the sun are known with greater exactness than by any other method.

Thus, when a certain age astronomical observer, remembering Bode's law, an artificial measure of the distance of the planets from the sun, can now tell the distance of the sun, the number of the planets and the size of the gap between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter to regularize the law, looked into the heavens.

Talbot Finds Corps

One of the most remarkable finds of the year was the discovery of a small planet, called Eros, by an Italian, from his observatory at Palermo. Sicily, inaugurated the new century in 1900 by finding the first baby planet in the solar system.

Other astronomers conducted a sky search and found more. Eventually, after sky photography, came to the aid of science, the number of the celestial bodies increased.

The bit of rock were considered to be either the remains of a comet or a planet that had been captured by a planet at which failed to escape.

By the time the 40th of the planet's infant days had been charted, its discovery had become as momentous that astronomers were becoming

slightly bored.

Then, in 1886, found, however, suddenly was duplicated August 15, 1898, when Dr. G. Witt, at the Urania observatory in Berlin, Germany, sighted a faint asteroid of the eleventh magnitude that was retrograding at the unprecedented rate of 10 degrees a day. This small minor planet, it was found to be widely observed.

The eccentric was Eros.

All the hundred or so asteroids found since 1898 lie between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter. Just as was found that Eros, at perihelion, came far within the orbit of Mars.






# Army Tests "Flying Wing" Built For Military Observation
