Navy Board Drafts Building Plans Requiring \$650,000,000

EXPERTS COMPLETE WORK, ADDING BY FIGURES IN TREATY

Program Extends Over Period of More Than Five Years and May Call For \$1,000,000,000 in End

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—The navy general board today had completed a building program within the provisions of the London treaty to be submitted to Secretary Adams for presentation to President Hoover.

Within the scope of the program, the board included prospective building and replacement plans in each category of vessels from submarines to battleships. The program is provided for bringing the navy to full treaty strength probably will extend over a period more than five years and cost between \$450,000,000 and \$1,000,000,000.

No indication has been given regarding the details of the construction plan or the categories in which the navy expects to build new vessels on several occasions recently, Admiral William V. Pratt, chief of naval operations, has expressed a desire for immediate construction of destroyers. It has been 14 years since a destroyer was built and none has been built since 1920.

There have been authoritative statements that the program calls for gradual replacement over a period of years in the 8-inch gun cruiser and submarine classes. The treaty allows the United States 24,700 tons of 8-inch gun cruisers of which it now has 10,000 tons at stake.

Settled Deal The board recently settled on a submarine design which would displace between 1000 and 1500 tons. It will carry a crew of 100 and a complement of two submarines. V boats will be equipped with nine or 11 8-1/2 inch boats which will be over age at the expiration of the treaty. Within the 1275 ton limit allowed the United States, the program calls for gradual replacement of the 1275 ton submarines. 20,000 tons remaining which come over the age limit of 1936 are the treaty limit.

In the battleship division board members have recommended modernization of the New Mexico, Mississippi and Idaho and the modernization of other dreadnaughts over the construction period.

The treaty allows the United States 10,000 tons of 8-inch gun cruisers. Of the 10,000 tons already are built or building. One more 10,000 ton, 8-inch cruiser may be built immediately. The new remaining 2000-ton class cruiser cannot be laid down until 1933, 1934 and 1935 respectively for completion in 1936, 1937 and 1938.

The treaty dependent within the treaty has ordered construction of a new aircraft carrier of 13,000 tons. When it is completed the United States will have 10,000 tons of carriers. The Lexington, the Saratoga and the new vessel, the USS Yorktown, has provided for the 13,000 tons to be built, bringing the category to treaty strength of 10,000 tons.

GOOD PERSONS IN CHINA PERISH AT BRIGANDS' HANDS

Dispatches Bring Estimates of Slaughter by Invading Communists at Kiangsi, in Province of Kiangsi

(By The Associated Press) BANGOR, Oct. 22.—Raided Chinese men and women have been massacred at Kiang, province of Kiangsi, by Communists in an orgy of slaying, looting and burning, said dispatches received today.

The raid, estimated to have taken place on October 15, razed the city and surrounding district in a matter of a few days. Thousands of others were slain as depredations continued.

First news of the massacre was brought by Bishop Mignani of the Italian Lazarist mission at Kiang, who with a Chinese Jesuit priest, arrested at Kiangsiang today. He had been released by "Reds" in an attempt to raise \$100,000 for the mission. He had been held at Kiangsiang for 10 days. He said he and the Jesuit priest, after being severely beaten and tortured through the night, left on foot October 16 to obtain aid for their mistreated charges. They included four Italian priests, four Italian, one French and five Chinese nuns held at Communist headquarters.

"When they left, no mission buildings had been fired but skeletons of buildings had been destroyed through church properties should missions for ransom not be forthcoming."

Report 8000 Deaths

Reporting deaths at Kiang had reached 8000, Chinese dispatches said immediately after capturing the city. Communists massacred prisoners and started disastrous fires. Flames and smoke were seen daily for three days.

"So many persons were murdered," the dispatch said, "that a constant stream of bodies was sent floating in the Kan River. Several hundred bodies were seen floating in the river."

TARIFF LIMITATIONS: The protective tariff affords protection to American products against competition on the American market...

How does it happen, he asks, that when a bushel of wheat costs a bushel on wheat, he can sell the bushel for only fifty cents a bushel, and with a tariff of three cents a pound on beans the market price for a certain variety of beans is only two and three-quarters cents a pound?

It is quite evident that he regards the tariff as a sort of bribe—in addition to the normal market price. He is mistaken, of course, but he has a hard time to blame for that, because there has been too much interest about the tariff, and sometimes those in position to do the work have permitted others to do the thinking, in fact, they have not deliberately contributed to their own undoing.

Beaides, the tariff has only within the past few years been brought into intimate relationship with the products of agriculture. All that the tariff can do in case of overproduction of any product is to guarantee that that product will not be sold at a price lower than the tariff is paid on the foreign product.

This tariff farmer may rest assured, regardless of the price he receives for his wheat, that his production is not competing with foreign-grown wheat and beans unless the tariff of forty-two cents a bushel on wheat and three cents a pound on beans has been paid on those foreign products.

Unless the foreign product can pay the tariff and still yield a profit to the producer, it is not going to come into this country so long as the tariff will stand. The tariff cannot prevent overproduction.

On the other hand, in case of a short-crop production the tariff on that crop could and would assure to American producers a very decided advantage, because the foreign product will not get into the American market without paying the tariff.

"Womanless" Library Appears Fruit of Founder's Life Study

Iowa Lawyer Makes Strange Will After Lifetime of Hating Women

Despite Unusual Request, Widow of Deceased "Philosopher" Declares Home Life Was "Ideally Happy"



T. M. Zink, Iowa lawyer, left his fortune to found a "womanless" library, but despite the fact that he gave vent to his hate of the other sex during his life his widow declares their life was happy.

TWIN FALLS, Iowa, Oct. 23 (The News)—The provision in his will for a "womanless" library was not born of a momentary whim or personal grievance.

It was the fruit of mature deliberation; a life-time of study.

In the document which seeks to set up a monument of hatred, the late Mrs. Zink attributed "my intense hatred of women" to his "experience with women, observation of them and study of all literature and philosophical works."

He will provide that the estate, valued from \$25,000 to \$50,000, is to be held in trust for 75 years before the "men only" library can be built.

The municipality which receives the bequest will provide after-

natives—may not impose taxes upon it during the trust period.

Zink's widow, whom his will permitted to live in their home provided she paid a \$40 monthly rental, said, "we were ideally happy" and she intends not to contest the will.

She knew her husband detested women in business but said he always was "most gracious to them socially."

Zink's private and professional life was stormy.

An Iowa judge once threatened him with a jail sentence for contempt of court, but the matter was dropped after Zink promised to spend his time behind the bars in writing a digest of the cases in which the judge had been wrongfully convicted.

After the death of his first wife and before his second marriage, the lawyer was threatened with a breach of promise suit. Hearing of this in his office, he became enraged, "kicked a black and white woman on a blanket couch, shouting:

"That's what I'll do to that woman."

Charges were filed but settled privately.

In a column which he wrote for a local newspaper, Zink frequently gave expression to his hatred philologically in somewhat such as these:

"Nature created a woman to nag man so he cannot forget her."

"Love a woman and she instantly becomes your tyrant."

Zink had never embraced a religion but the ministers were petitioners at his funeral.

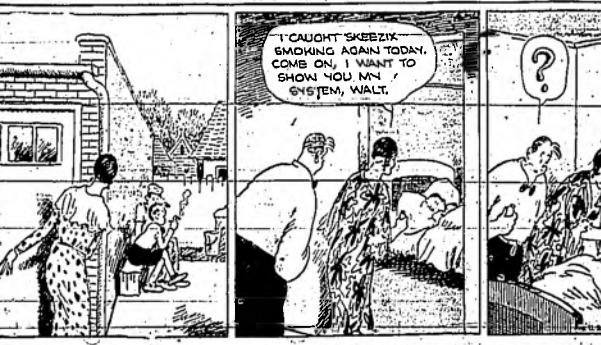

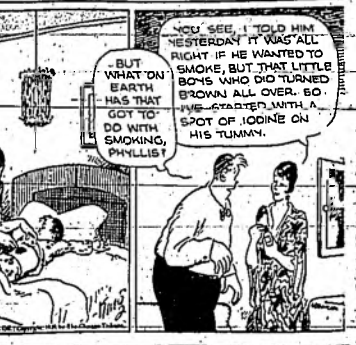
