MERCHANT SEEKS SOUND BASIS FOR TRADE STRUCTURE

J. C. Penney Brings Message of Courage and Optimism to Kiwanis Club Members of Twin Falls County



B RINGING a message of courage and optimism in regard to the country's general social and economic structure, J. C. Penney, founder and chairman of the board of the J. C. Penney company, addressed Kiwanians of Buhi, Filer and Twin Falls and a number of their guests at a joint meeting at dinner at the Rogers hotel here last evening.

Mr. Penney, who has been actively engaged in retail merchandising for 28 years past since he established his store at Duncan, Wyoming, extended his tour of the Central West and the Pacific coast and Intermountain states. He was introduced at last evening by W. E. Robinson, manager of the J. C. Penney company store here and president of Twin Falls Kiwanis club.

Mr. Penney delivered his speech on "Our Changing Economic Structure."

Merchandise Held Key

He predicted that the key to the economic situation and it will be good business judgments so to organize the business of retailing "that they may keep the retail in their hands."

"Any organization which will be the force which will glean the benefits or suffer the consequences of our present economic conditions,"

Mr. Penney branded as "a distinct menace to all retail business," plans that he said are being carried out to dominate the market.

"Any legislative method which, in the end, results in keeping retail prices high and dominant, that is what I am against," he said.

"Any legislation, in my opinion, that would be directed toward the control of business, would be a definite hindrance to the buying of one of the major business activities of the state."

"We are also approaching the year of when of necessity there will be a reduction in the amount of those who are necessities."

"Now that we are approaching the winter season we are realizing that each man employed means perhaps more to him than to anyone else, and we must furnish him these financial purchases power which will enable him to buy more."

Given his view of the economic situation in the light of his own long experience supplemented by recent events, Mr. Penney said:

"Only a few months past I traveled through the south and the southwest visiting merchants, newspaper publishers and other business men to turn them back, maintaining their personnel, building for an increasingly prosperous future."

"In the end, the cost and therefore, economic structure of the country has found a new base, and that base is sound one. It provides for national expansion, for a better life for all to the extent which comes for a long time prior to the deflation of the market value of securities."

New York Out of Town

"I had come from New York City where I had been engaged in business and had gone to the bottom and seemed likely to stay there. Yet I found home wherever I went going to work again, turning back, maintaining their personnel, building for an increasingly prosperous future."

"In the end, the cost and therefore, economic structure of the country has found a new base, and that base is sound one. It provides for national expansion, for a better life for all to the extent which comes for a long time prior to the deflation of the market value of securities."

"The drop in commodity prices such as foodstuffs, volume of industrial output and trade for the first eight months of the year is ahead of last year's rate of fact that, in many of our volume moving items, there have been declines in price in proportion to as high as 40 per cent in some cases."

"An urgent duty, which the responsibility of the majority of us is that of restoring public confidence and realizing that the story of bust does not really come to told."

ANCIENT TOWNS OF ITALY MAKE MERRY AS WEDDING NEARS

Beautiful Hill Cities Blaze With Thousands of Lights As Time Comes for Marriage of Princess Giovanna

(By The Associated Press) **SSISI, Italy, Oct. 21—**The beautiful hill towns of Umbria, from Spoleto to Assisi and Perugia, blazed tonight with tens of thousands of lights on the eve of the wedding of Princess Giovanna of Italy, and Boris, King of Bulgaria.

At a given signal an enormous program of lights began at the churches and palaces. Church bells pealed forth for 15 minutes at command of the bishop of Assisi and every town in the thousands of miles that swarmed the streets. In the throng were some of the most important personages in the world.

The first note of a band played in the Bulgarian national anthem in the public square.

Musical Arches

Princess Giovanna arrived today and went to the Villa Venini, belonging to the wealthy S. P. Venini, who has a villa in the Rockies, Kansas City, Missouri.

Former Queen Sophia, Greece, was the first guest to arrive.

After a month's complete tour of the town, visiting the upper and lower churches of St. Francis.

Gradually the other invited priests and officials arrived, including the day.
