



## THOMAS PREDICTS BETTER CONDITIONS

Idaho's Junior Senator in Address Here Takes Optimistic View of Things

Senator John Thomas Gooding, in a radio address delivered here last evening, outlined world-wide economic conditions and predicted two years, taking an optimistic view of the situation and declaring his belief that "we have about reached the bottom of the trough" and that you will see a slow but gradual improvement in conditions throughout the world.

"This is no time to rock the boat," Senator Thomas declared. "The president should be given a free hand to control the economy. Let us trust that the pessimists who say that we are going to have a lower standard of living in this country, which is not true." The senator argued, President Hoover's policies had led to "escape from the financial panic which followed the stock market crash, any radical decline in security values, and an avoidance of wage cuts which economically stricken Jockeys and much suffering in the working groups."

Senator Thomas, accompanied by his secretary, Dr. Lester C. Walker, left early this morning for Twin Falls where he is to fill a speaking engagement this evening. They spent last night at Rupert.
