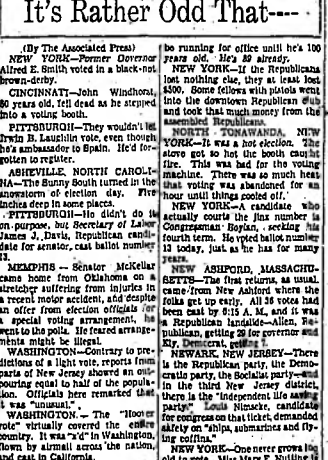

31-Vote Margin Keeps England's Labor Faction In Power

MAJORITY OF ONLY 31-VOTES-INSURES MACDONALD'S RULE

Crucial Test for Laborites Results From Ballot On Motion by England's Conservatives For Amendment

(By The Associated Press) LONDON, Nov. 6.—A majority of only 31 votes carried the Ramsay MacDonald government safely through the first important parliamentary session of the present parliament. This was regarded as a crucial test, for the balloting was on a motion by the Conservative party to amend the speech in reply to the address from the throne.

The amendment was defeated by 31 votes to 52. The speech from the throne, delivered by King George V at the opening of parliament, was widely hailed by the Labor party, has been under bitter attack for two days, the Conservative opposition, the voters of the Laborites to propose any amendments to "cut" or "cut" the growth of unemployment.

Supporters of the administration feared earlier in the week that the Labor party, which has been losing power and disgruntled leaving Laborites might combine with the Conservatives to bring about a government defeat, but this danger was entirely removed when the Laborites decided yesterday to abstain from voting on the amendment.

A matter of fact, the Laborites, including Sir John Simon, voted against the government tonight but they were almost completely outnumbered by four members of the same party who stood by the administration.

Political commentators credit the victory to the fact that the Laborites and Conservatives are still united in their desire to turn the government out now and they anticipate a general election, hence the Laborites were able to find a compromise by the fact that they are extremely critical of the administration.
