



### AMEE McPHERSON USES WRONG NAME

### Cuban Immigration Authorities Refuse Evangelist Permission to Land

HAVANA, Nov. 12 (AP)—Amee McPherson, a Cuban immigration official, has refused permission to land here until she has identified herself as the person who has come from Panama under the fictitious name of "Dolly Adams," remained aboard the ship at 8 o'clock tonight. Immigration officials said she was registered aboard the ship as an English woman.

She was brought to the port by newspapermen who revealed her identity to the purser of the ship. McPherson, who said her name was Adams but did not furnish immigration officials with any means to identify her under the name.

She previously had issued instructions that she was not to be asked and when she "Dolly Adams" was in her cabin with a group of friends.

Passengers said Mrs. McPherson had enjoyed the trip up from Panama, once points in the uniforms of the chief engineer, for amateur photographs. She refused to pose for the press photographers.

She told immigration officials that she might remain on the island and go into New York, or might leave tomorrow.

Burley Chamber Arranges to Join in Celebration of Completion of Raft River Link of Idaho Highway

(Special to The News) BURLEY, Nov. 12—Chamber of Commerce directors are preparing to celebrate the completion of the Raft River cut-off highway, uniting northern Utah with the Burley and Twin Falls districts.

Among notable invited to attend are: Governor H. O. Harridge, Idaho; Governor George H. Dern, Utah; Senator-elect C. Ben Ray, Idaho; the state highway commissioners of both states and the local highway commissioners of each state and local counties.

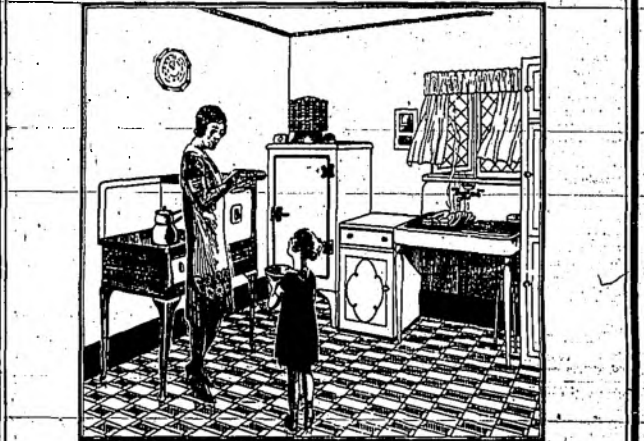

# ROAD BUILDERS OF IDAHO DECLARE FOR STATE COMMISSION

## Highway and Good Roads Districts' Delegates Go On Record For Share in Gasoline Tax Revenues

Idaho road builders, represented by 17 delegates at an annual meeting of the Idaho Association of Highway and Good Roads Districts (hereinafter referred to as the "association"), met in Boise today for the purpose of electing delegates to the state highway and good roads district commission.

Resolutions adopted by the meeting declared for alteration of state law to provide for exemption of highway and good roads districts from payment of the five-cent gasoline tax; for division of gasoline tax revenues between the state and local districts; for prohibition by the state in the purchase of road rights of way, and for payment of 85 per cent of expenses to local district commissioners.

The association met to hold its next meeting at Coeur d'Alene in September, 1937.

On re-call on the proposition to substitute a commission for the commissioner of public works to administer state highways, only the delegates from Nampa voted in the proposition.

One speaker referred to the proposed commission as a "three-man commission" of local districts, and another argued that the commission could make savings sufficient to justify payment of salaries of two or four members of the proposed commission.

Although the resolution adopted did not suggest the number of the proposed commission, delegates during discussion of the proposition repeatedly referred to a "three-man commission."

Resolution asking gasoline tax exemption for highway and good roads districts provided for exemption to apply to gasoline used by the districts only in road construction and maintenance operations. It was carried by a vote of 17 to 1.

Without a dissenting vote, the meeting adopted the resolution calling for a division of gasoline tax revenues between the state and the local districts.

Speaking in support of the proposition a delegate asserted that his district had paid twenty-thousand dollars of the cost of all the state highways in that district, besides building and maintaining its own roads. He stated that Twin Falls county paid, and obligated itself to pay \$500,000 for construction of road later taken over by the state. J. D. Birens, Twin Falls highway district supervisor of highways, reported to the meeting. He estimated gasoline tax payments in this county this year will total \$100,000, of which nearly 100,000 will be paid in Twin Falls highway district.

He was commander of the 11th regiment of the Idaho national guard, and was killed in action during the Mexican border in 1916.

In civilian life he was a well known Idaho's outstanding attorney, and at the general election last week he was elected district judge.

Mr. Koster said that word has just been received by the Jerome Cooperative Creamery office that its product was the first prize as the best butter exhibited from Idaho at the St. Louis dairy show which has just concluded, and that this has caused much gratification as the butter from this creamery won the first prize at the California fair last month.

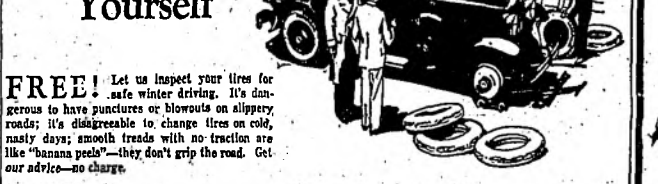
