BUYER BEWARE

Idaho beans are not too popular in some eastern Oregon towns, according to reports brought back by Twin Falls visitors to that region recently.

Operations of a pair of swindlers dealing with grocers are said to have given the Idaho product a bad name in that territory.

The story goes that the swindling pair, traveling through the country with a truck load of beans, call on merchants, one going ahead with a sample of the best grade of Idaho beans that he offers to sell for five dollars a hundred pounds. The swindler makes a special speech to the effect that he is giving away his secret formula for marketing pathological beans, doing his best in marketing of last season's big bean crop in Idaho. Delivery from the truck is made shortly after the order is taken.

The swindler is a particularly noisy concern over satisfying the customer, boasting that the bag of beans delivered be placed on the scales to make certain of full weight.

Disillusionment comes after the swindlers have disappeared when the buyer opens the bag and finds that he has bought, not first grade beans shown in the sample, but split and broken beans, that, although, sell here for twenty-five cents a bag.

The transaction is regrettable from several points of view, while it suggests a number of possible causes of procedure.

Certainly effort should be directed toward catching the swindlers and when they are caught they should be punished.

A law might be passed, like the potato grade and marketing law, to safeguard Idaho produce customers, but solving this is a legitimate market for broken and split beans, which seem to offer good reason for putting up new standards and adding to the burdens of enforcement officers.

The situation, finally, must serve as another warning to buyers to be on their guard when dealing with swindlers.

ECONOMIC BUNK

A lot of current economic thought leads to the conclusion, apparently, business depression is caused by working too hard, producing too much, inventing labor-saving machinery, producing too much and accumulating too large a volume of goods and money. In short, by using thrift, energy and intelligence in the pursuit of comfort, security and wealth.

The remedy prescribed by this school of thinkers is to ease up, slack on the job, shorten hours, make less and spend more. They all have got behind getting ahead; now we'll reverse the process and get ahead by getting behind.

We won't gain anything by being lazy and dumb instead of industrious and intelligent.

We simply haven't got the knack of keeping our backs from running smooth. It's all we can do. We don't sit right, or don't feel it right, or don't make quite the right adjustments. Particularly we haven't learned the trick of adapting production to consumption.

Suppose industry were war. Wouldn't we have generals keeping a careful eye on the operations as a whole, and shifting materials, equipment and men from moment to moment and place to place as they were needed?

These times peaceful industrial activity will have such general, continually adjusting money, workers, machinery and finished products.

And it need not be socialistic or

Fascism, either. We could do it in this country right now if we had the nerve and the imagination. As a matter of fact, we're rapidly drifting toward such super-management of our industries, probably by private enterprise, with a little bentonite thrown in from the government.

FITTING FOR JOBS

Study of four hundred eighty-seven educational institutions reveals that their total enrollment this year is more than a thousand greater than the last school year. The four hundred eight senior include college, boarding schools for girls, prep schools for boys, and vocational institutes.

# Thousands Of Persons Cheer Notre Dame Team In Two Cities

## Scenes in Chicago Resemble Days of Late World Strife

Hundreds of Police Prove Powerless to Cope With Surging Crowds Gathered at LaSalle Street Station

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Dec. 10.—Knute Rockne and his famous Notre Dame troupe of Raiders came back to their home stamping around again today to receive probably the noisiest double-barreled ovation ever boomed for an athletic team.

The thousands of persons fought their way through and got a glimpse of the national football champions as they paraded through Chicago's streets; the enthusiastic fans who had seen the student body of Notre Dame showed themselves hours after they entered the city.

Note Dame and Chicago have offered orations for explorers, celebrities, or every sort and mighty teams of veterans, but few have drawn the one given the "fighting Irish," today.

It resembled somewhat the fury and tumult which greeted the armistice of the World War. Hundreds of police were powerless to stop the surging crowd.

It was like Rockne remarked when it was all over:

"We thought we had been through some hard times, but this year, but the lines we had, the police had to fight today had 'em all beat.'

The Chicago ovation was of an hour's length but intense in its hammering, crushing and crowding. It took the players, coaches and officials of the Notre Dame team fully 20 minutes to fight through the large crowd that jammed the concourse of the LaSalle street station.

Station Packed

The South Bend stadium was fast of arrival, and racing of six blocks as the Notre Dame conquerors came home from their last Saturday's victory over Southern California.

John J. McGivern, president of the university; Captain Adam Walsh of the famous Notre Dame "Four Horsemen" of '24, and 100 other members of the undrafted 1924 eleven; members of the 1926 team and Rockne himself were among spectators in the packed gymnasium.

Rockne, worn out, and almost on the verge of collapse, gave one of his wills to the press, and then was rocked to a sit by his stethoscopes with applause.

"I am a great team," he told his players, "I'm not going to say you were greater than the teams of '24, '25 and '26. They all set me to compare you with the 'Four Horsemen,' but I can't."
