## WOMAN CONFESSES KILLING AUCTIONEER IN SALT LAKE CITY

### Jean Dayle Tells of Dealing Blow Fatal to Companion in Hotel Room and Taking Possessions

SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 10 (AP)—Jean Dayle, confined to police detectives here this evening, they announced, that she killed Sam Frank, jewelry auctioneer of Memphis, Tennessee, in his hotel room here last Saturday morning.

The woman's confession, the police said, followed a four-hour grilling. She declared she alone was responsible for the slaying and robbery of the 35-year-old auctioneer.

"There was nobody with me at the time," she said. "I could not know he was dead. There was nobody with me."

Three True Names

She said her true name is Wilma Oates and she was born in Hampton, Iowa. She has a mother living in Seattle.

Frank was found slain in his hotel room Saturday morning when a chambermaid entering to make it up should have been treated as if he was bound and gagged. Jewelry, money and credit valued at about \$400 had been stolen from him.

The police woman was recognized when she telephoned from a garage in Salt Lake and obtained her clothing from her own hotel. She was located yesterday at the home of a friend here. At first she confessed having drugged Frank and denied the slaying, declaring two men had pushed into his room and attacked him and then fled with the valuables.

The police woman pleaded "I am a detective to keep the knowledge of her act from her mother."

"I'm 70 years old and the shock would surely kill me," she said. "I'm for her and that is all I am going to tell the truth. There was a man who pushed into the room, bound and gagged and I'll never give him a name. It was my own idea to get Frank out of the room."

## PRESIDENT HOOVER SENDS PROTOCOLS OF COURT ON WAY

### Senator Borah, Chairman of Powerful Foreign Relations Committee, Prepares to Call Up Issue

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP)—The protocols of the American adherence to the world court were sent to the senate today by President Hoover with a message asking consideration as soon as the emergency relief and appropriation legislation had been enacted.

Friend and foe in the senate immediately expressed the view there was little hope for consideration at this session and Senator Watson, Indiana, announced he would introduce legislation to suspend the ratification of the league.

The subject received the same in the midst of a bitter speech as usual in support of his criticisms of those seeking ratification of the league.

Senator Borah, chairman of the foreign relations committee, announced he would call up at the next regular meeting a week from today.

## IDAHO INSURANCE TAX NETS STATE \$550,000

BOISE, Dec. 10 (AP)—The state board of insurance today reported that the tax on insurance premiums during the period from 1929 to 1930, a record for the state, amounted to \$550,000.

## NEZ PERCE RESIDENTS USE WHEAT FOR FUEL

### Most Spectacular Chapter in Annals of Aviation Ends With Survivors of Trio Land at White Horse

(By The Associated Press) WHITE HORSE, Yukon Territory, Dec. 10—Two months after they disappeared in a seaplane in the frozen Yukon wilderness, Bob Marten, Wrangell, Alaska, prospector and Emil Keating, German plane mechanic, were found alive today by their pilot, Captain E. J. A. Barker, who was shot down.

After their three lives were presumed to have lost their lives in the search and two more were missing three weeks later, Barker's crew flew back here today with Marten and Keating, both in the last stages of starvation.

They said Barker died from exposure November 20. The plane with the frozen back to bring in the bodies.

## KANSAS CITY BANK GIVES UP \$45,000

### Four Men Escape With Big Sum After Holding Officer at Bay for Hour

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 10 (AP)—Four unnamed robbers took charge of the First National bank today and held employees at bay with pistols for more than an hour, making the opening hours of a time lock on the vault.

The quartet fled with loot estimated at \$45,000.

One man followed Alvin Young, former banker, into the bank, located on the second floor of the Livestock Exchange building in the downtown district. He showed an automobile pistol and ordered Young to proceed with the morning business as though nothing unusual was happening.

One by one the bank employees and officers came in to begin the day's work. Each was compelled to "sign right over" or "go over to the corner and sit down with the crowd."

Twenty-seven men had gathered before the vault could be opened. While the time clock clicked away the minutes before its opening, bank employees were ordered to remain in the vault with the robbers.

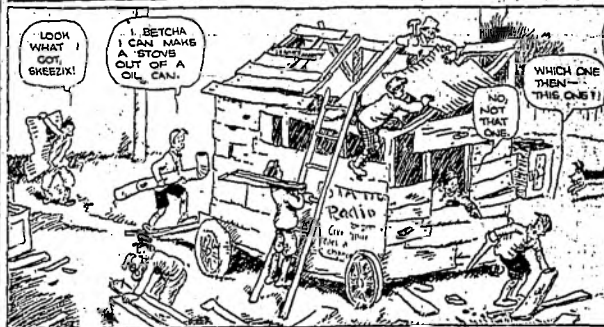
