

Ramon Franco, Spanish Flying Hero, Tells Of Revolution

FREEDOM OF SPAIN OBJECT OF REVOLT DECLARAS AVIATOR

Idol of People Explains Reasons for Failure of Uprising Bent On Gaining Liberty From Oppression

MAFRA, Portugal, Dec. 16.—Ramo Franco, Spain's most celebrated young trans-Atlantic aviator, came into Madrid bursting about him like a squadron of army planes on the half-till; he left behind none of the blinding emotion which led him yesterday into a brief revolt, against the Spanish throne.

Today he is in the officers' quarters of the Spanish air force, unshaved and his round face grave, talking about what led up to the Spanish revolution and explaining why he started it.

"They probably think of me," he said, waving his cigar in the general direction of the airman who had just entered, "but I tell you, I am a patriot fighting for the freedom of my country. Who says the revolt in Spain is something started by the Communists is lying."

On Okinawa of Capital

For the first time he revealed that he had been in Okinawa, his recent escape from a Spanish prison where he was being held for a political offense, had been on the outside of the capital.

"I'd been held under General Alfonso tomorrow," he cried. "I would be a monarchist. We are not a people who have given up fighting for the freedom of Spain. I escaped from a prison because I am a man of the people and while they locked me up, I got out."

He added: "I was here from Madrid than a little place on the outskirts of the city. I knew there was in the wind and I would not let them catch me."

That was as far as he would go about those adventures, he must have had beginning with his arrival in Okinawa, he said, he was still a prisoner of the old censor near Madrid which the army had turned into a prison for journalists.

"The press was suppressed," he said, "and asked me to join in the revolution. Understood, I was not the first to do it. I was one of the first of the old censors."

"Well, I said I would join them. I would join any movement, I told them, which would bring freedom to Spain. That is the reason I got out this morning," continued he, referring to Captain Perme, the Galan Rodriguez, an officer at the Cuartel general who was executed after he was captured.

Throughout the day there had been conflicting reports on the illness of the war-time general.

According to hear that Mr. Perme had been shot dead in Madrid last night all morning to rumors which finally reached the chamber of deputies, where many politicians fled from the room in alarm.

Mr. Jackson, the Spanish ambassador, told reporters that Mariano was to pay their respects to the deceased statesman.

They have been the expression of the aristocracy of the clergy, of the capitalists, who ride the horse of the revolution."

"The time is coming, it is near at hand. We will guide the people along the road to freedom."

The other man who was seated with him, a tall, thin man, was quartered in a military ground school here while Portuguese pondered the delicate question of what to do with them.
