Idol of People Explains Reasons for Failure of Uprising Bent on Gaining Liberty From Oppression

MADRID, Portugal, Dec. 16 (AP)—Ramon Franco, a 34-year-old young trans-Atlantic aviator, came into Portugal on the run with a group of army planes on his back, but he left behind him the blaring emotion which he left yesterday in a brief report against the Spanish throne.

Today he sat in the officers' quarters of the Alameda, his eyes fixed unblinkingly on the map of Spain which he had left up on the wall. He was talking about the Spanish revolution and explaining how it was started.

"The probably thing of me," he said, "was my flying in the general movement of the Spanish people. I tell you, I am a patriot, fighting for the freedom of my country. We saw the revolution as something started by the Communists in the districts of Madrid.

Then for the first time he revealed that all during the time since his flight from Madrid he had been in the hands of the British, but that he had been held for a political offense, he had been on the staff of the Spanish army.

"It Spain could be free under Alfonso XIII," he cried, "I would have fought for it. I am a man of spirit and while they were in the hands of the British, I would have fought for it. I would have fought for it. I would have fought for it.

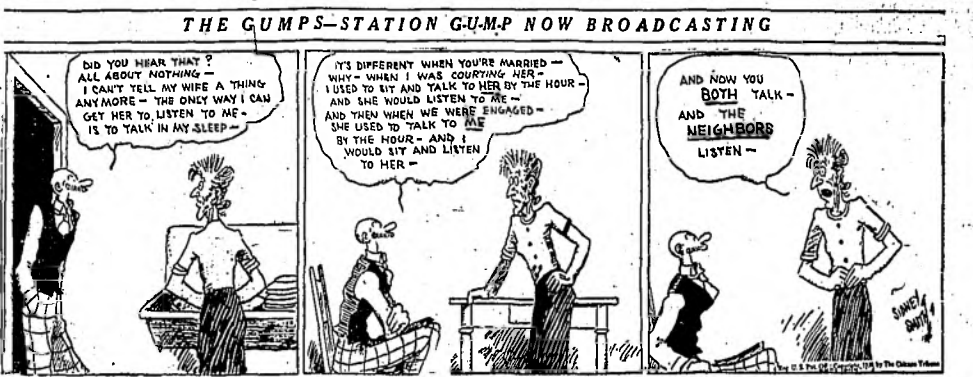

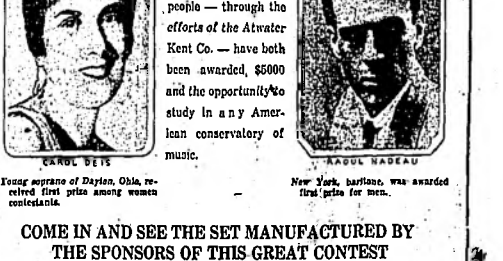
