

POWER COMMISSION LETS EMPLOYEES BO

Chairman Smith Announces Dismissal of Three Attached to Organization

WASHINGTON. Dec. 26 (UPI)—Chairman Smith of the power commission has ordered the dismissal of three of its employes had been decided upon by a quorum of the commission. McMichael, of North Carolina, and Ralph J. Williamson, Washington, had not been consulted because they had not been consulted.

He and Frank R. McNinch, North Carolina, are the two members of the new commission who have not yet appeared in Washington to be sworn in. Williams said he and his associates did not believe the other three members would take affirming action until the full board is assembled.


