HYDE ISSUES EDICT MADE TO INCREASE USE OF CORN SUGAR

Administrative Ruling Holds Presence of Product in Preparation of Food Need Not be Declared on Label

(By The Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26 (AP)—An administrative ruling today Secretary Hyde held the use of pure refined corn sugar in the preparation of any article of food need not be declared upon the label.

Hyde expressed the opinion that the ruling would stimulate consumption of corn sugar, and would be especially beneficial to the country without affecting the domestic sugar producer.

Hyde said the ruling "removes a distinction between refined corn sugar which has too long been permitted," adding the requirement that it be declared on labels is a matter of law but "administrative interpretation of the law."

"There exists a potential market for corn sugar through the manufacture of ice cream, confectionery, etc.," he estimated at from 5,000,000 to 10,000,000 bushels per year," the secretary.

"The reason for the old departmental ruling has disappeared," he said, pointing out that when refined corn sugar was used in the preparation of food it was a matter of law but "administrative interpretation of the law."
