Aid Goes to Sick, Aged, Poor, Youth Seeking Education, Science and All Distressed Humanity

NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—(Special Telegram)—The year 1930 was a year of unexampled distress to the world's youth seeking education, all science and distressed humanity all received aid from the philanthropies.

Experts in the business of philanthropy noticed some interesting conditions about the year and which may have been struck by business depression, but multi-millionaires combined their philanthropies on a large scale and community chest collections went up 10 per cent over last year.

The estimated \$400,000,000 does not include amount charity funds raised by benefits and tag days, nor does it take in available governmental relief.

Foundations spent millions outright gifts for the sick or feeble and education amounting to approximately \$100,000,000 for the first 11 months of the year and the amount totaled as much as \$100,000,000.


