SMITH'S BILL PASSES



A HUMAN DOCUMENT

No tablet from Sinal is the long-awaited Wickerham committee's report dealing with problems in the United States.

"Everyone will admit, I suppose, that some system to deal with the inflationary situation is necessary; therefore of the merits or demerits of the report, under the circumstances which now prevail, I do not care to say. In this connection, the upper-shelf and the great debate will go forward on repeat or circumlocution."

Under the heading "Borah Refers," it seems that the Senator refers to a statement that he made in his speech before the House of Representatives on January 10, 1930, in which he said:

"The inflationary movement must be hastened on the question that it is, let us say, and, if it would be hard to find grounds for quarrel with the Senator's advice, then let the people decide."

PAYING OUR DEBTS

Last year was a bad business year, as everyone knows, and yet a good year—it was a year of debt-paying.

With less income than usual, the nation paid off more old obligations than it had been paying in years of prosperity.

A national review says:

"Of stock exchange losses, the most important were those of the insurance companies, which have paid off upwards of six billion, five hundred million dollars since the market bottomed out in October, 1929, to satisfy the demands of the payment of installments of credit and other forms of indebtedness."

The nation is in financial condition, it means the release of an enormous amount of funds for current purchases.

And not only that, but the people having paid off their old debts are once more in a position to contract new ones and to start all over again in the hope of getting current funds by anticipating future income."

NEW YORK, Jan. 21—Robert Legendre, rated as one of America's greatest all-round athletes, died of bronchial pneumonia today at the age of 35.

He had been a lieutenant in the naval dental corps for the last two and a half years, and death occurred at the naval hospital in Brooklyn where he was admitted three days ago.

Most of his athletic success was scored while a student at George Washington University. For three years he was national pentathlon champion, and although known principally for his performances on the track, he was also a star back on the Georgetown football team and also was prominent in swimming and boating.

In the early 1920's, while in Paris, he established a world record for the broad jump in a leap of 23 feet 5 inches. The record has since been broken.

For the past two years he had helped coach the Navy track team. The body will be sent to his home in Lewiston, Maine, for burial.
