

ONLY GROWERS IN NEED GET AID OF SEED LOAN FUND

Congress Confines Distribution of \$45,000,000 to Farmers in Drought Region

Where Losses Occurred

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23.—The Senate did not act so soon after the drought in 1930 will be eligible for aid from the \$45,000,000 seed loan fund authorized by Congress.

And then it may get assistance

only if it can't get credit.

Those conditions imposed by the Senate农业部的定义 of the bill, which includes all forms of credits that all farmers everywhere who were in need of money for seed, livestock feed, farm equipment, and other supplies, and whose sources of credit were closed, were granted loans.

Under the new law, the maximum of funds to come to 20 or 25 states and to counties within those states where drought and storm damage occurred, will be available for loans of up to \$100,000 each to farmers who have applied for loans from the regional disturbing offices probably at St. Louis for the work in Missouri, Kansas, Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Colorado, Memphis for Tennessee, Arkansas, Mississippi, Alabama and Louisiana; at Grand Forks, North Dakota, for the work in North Dakota, Minnesota, South Dakota, Iowa, Nebraska, Washington and possibly Montana; and at Washington for Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Ohio, West Virginia and other states of the nation.

Enough relief chairman of each state's emergency committee, which administers the loan fund, will estimate on the number of counties that will be eligible for aid, and will need assistance.

As far as possible the county and regional relief committees will be asked to submit their names on merit of each application for aid.

Interest About Five Cent

Interest on the loans probably will be five cents a month, and the crop to be produced taken at security. Ordinarily the farmer's net will be renewable.

But the farmer is expected

to apply on the applications once they reach the disturbing offices. It is said that any applicant may receive a loan even if he has lost his job within a week.

There is some indication that the average size of the loans may be

from \$100 to \$150, and that the amount loaned will be based on

the 1929 market value of the land

IN FAIRNESS

might give a lift to a friend or neighbor

or other pedestrian as a matter

of kindness or accommodation.

Washington is the first in the West

to introduce such a bill.

ALL-AMERICAN LEAGUE

The George-Howard newspaper

own problems and its own spirit,

and should stand, together in some sort,

of flexible federation, when the rest of the world is organized.

Such an organization, with Uncle

Sam at its head, might start its

career auspiciously by taking over

the Monroe Doctrine, which Uncle

Sam also has more and more trouble

explaining and applying. With the

Latin-American nations joined in its

defenses rather than as allies, it may

now be more effective than ever,

and let us hope so.

RUSSIAN RAILROADS

A weak feature of the Russian five-year industrialization program has been the railroads. In planning its swift and gigantic development of industry, the Soviet government neg-

lected them and appropriated very

little money for transportation de-

velopment.

The weakness is to be corrected,

Anton, Moscow's commercial agent


