























## MINISTER HONORS MEMORY OF GREAT MARTYR PRESIDENT

Pastor of First Presbyterian Church Praises Character of Abraham Lincoln as Human and Citizen

"Calling on his audience to join in 'honoring ourselves as we honor others,' the Rev. James Miller, pastor of First Presbyterian Church here, said that man is the true son of God; that man of the ages who in his life and labors most nearly approached the ideal manhood we revere; ideals we cherish, for ever perpetuate virtues we initiate, achievements we reproduce, and the spirit and character we would reproduce." Rev. James Miller, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, spoke at the annual meeting of the Kiwanis club at their meeting at the Roosevelt hotel last evening to the officers and successors of the Great Emancipator.

Rev. Miller declared that on February 12, 1860, two babies were born, one of whom was to become the nation's first citizen after Lincoln, and the other on men's bodies and souls. Abraham Lincoln and Charles Douglass were the two children; George Washington, "ancestor of the old civilization," and Lincoln, "master builder of the new civilization."

"A few men and women," he said, "make their national glories, while others make their national sins." The Valley Illustrated Patriot Schellier and Humboldt listed Germany, Angelo, Galilee and Bruno among the great men of the world. Precious treasure of our own nation is at the heart of our nation. The congressional library contains more than 200,000 volumes, he said. He has written himself across the country in the hearts of the nation's people.
