

SMALL BUSINESS

Legislature—Legislature over the  
nearly-day dinner bill that was passed  
yesterday by the Governor's  
veto probably is not shared by very  
many of Idaho's citizens.On the contrary, there seems to  
be a general, and perhaps more or  
less generally over the State, a disposition  
to blame the Legislature for  
buying itself with a master of small  
importance in three last days of  
the Session that has so little of con-  
stitutive achievement to its credit, and so much of real importance call-  
ing for attention.Outside of the Legislature, the up-  
date Nevada's hurry-up did  
not receive much notice. It was to be  
taken very seriously, and the Legis-  
lature, perhaps, vied its importance  
with the Senate, rather than the Jus-  
tice Department.Probably this will not be willing  
to go so far in her bid for the foreign  
drive track.

CONTINUING DEMAND

Demand for tax relief in Idaho is  
not greater nor less than it was  
when the State convened  
early this year.Demanding from reduction  
of state expenditures has been  
permitted to the extent that some  
hope has been held out for re-  
lief of the tax load, to spread it  
among the states.In session now for fifty-eight days, and due to close tomorrow, the Legis-  
lature has effectively closed the way  
to relief in the first direction, and  
has worked out no tax reduction  
program.Such delay will be hard to explain.  
About all the data that could have  
been expected in the session has been  
made available to the Legislature. It has had the accumulated experi-  
ence of years of concern over the tax  
problem. It has had the twelve  
thousand dollar report of the tax  
commissioner for which the proceed-  
ing Session made provision. It has  
had the Governor's adaptation of the  
Federal income tax law, and the  
Governor's scheme to tax electric en-  
ergy generated in the state. And, finally, it has had the recom-  
mendations made by a tax consultant hired  
by the present Session for two thousand  
dollars.There has been enough, apparently,  
of study and investigation, to warrant  
some definite action. Reflection  
is not to be expected in the first attempt,  
but, unless there is a first step, there  
will be no advance.

A CORNER TURNED

The strength shown by the stock  
market lately, an investment expert  
says, is a "psychological strength,"  
meaning that the expert doesn't see  
much business improvement yet to  
justify it. The improvement is in

## INDEPENDENT BEAN MEN SELECT THREE MEMBER DIRECTORS

**Session Takes Steps to Be-  
gin Intensive Drive to  
Meet Farm Board Require-  
ment in Time Allotted**

Organization of independent growers of Great Northern white beans for cooperation in a new pool will be held at Twin Falls on March 10. The association took place yesterday with the retention of W. H. Detwiler, Hammon, chairman, and election of three members of the board.

Mr. Detwiler, P. E. Dean, Twin Falls, and H. O. Olavitz, Helotier, were selected as directors to act with the regular directors in the administration and control of the pool. The two sets of directors with officers of the regular association will meet in conference at the Hotel Idaho Saturday.

Further steps forward organization were taken by appointment of chairman for several towns represented in the association. These included different directions from the city of Twin Falls to lead in the work of organizing the independent growers or existing in the area. This was done by a W. Jones, Washington, representing the federal farm board.

Local "champions" numbered—grapevines in Jerome, C. A. Beaster, Clover; John Fahn, Hansen; C. M. Fisher, Kimberly; Carl Hansen, Clore; C. F. Jones, Twin Falls; A. Johnson, Eden; W. H. Wesley, Albert Cedarsburg, Charles Ewing, Wilmer Harrison, W. H. Harrison, Leo Joach, John T. Collier, Twin Falls. A meeting of all 250 bean growers attended the meeting.

The new pool, if perfected as planned, will include all the beans produced in the state by the Idaho Bean Growers Association and Wyoming and Montana associations. To March 10, 40 per cent of all beans held by the association are held by the Idaho Bean Growers Association, 25 per cent by the Idaho and 25 per cent of all beans held by independent growers in Montana. There are 11 states where beans are raised, but the number of growers in Wyoming at this time, should the pool be completed, Mr. Jones said, will control 75 per cent of all Great Northern beans.

**\$5 Entrance Fee**

Independents joining the association temporarily for the purpose of participating in the new pool will not participate in either the profits or the expenses of the Southern Idaho Bean Growers Association prior to March 2. After that date, the new pool committee deducted from the first re-

mittment at the termination of the pool.

Other charges imposed previously when beans have been sold, include \$10 entry fee for sack 15 cents per sack for cleaning. In addition there will be a service charge of 1 cent a month, or \$600 cents. There will be a charge of 15 cents to the Tri-State Bean Corporation for each sack of beans, plus a charge of 1 cent a month, or \$600 cents, interest, which it is estimated may total 8½ cents, or a total of 50½ cents a sack of 100 pounds, Mr. Jones said.

Mr. Jones again explained for the benefit of those who were not present at the Saturday meeting, that arrangements had been made so that the association could borrow from the government up to two cents a pound on \$2 a sack. This Mr. Jones said, would be a great assistance in getting the beans for any unpaid balance, it was stated.

Whether the full amount borrowed would be repaid to the government, in the event that the owner of beans had borrowed money at a bank, and desired to take advantage of the arrangement, would depend on the consent of the banker, advanced had on his obligation the amount advanced through the association, the banker having the right to accept or decline the beans for any unpaid balance, it was stated.

The amount of interest will depend upon the supplemental institution, but it will be 5 per cent, and for a reasonable intermediate credit, the bank will turn the money and on this there will be a charge of 4 per cent interest, so that since it will not carry all of it, the farmer would put up the balance charging 11 per cent interest on such balance.

While the interest will be higher, the interest will be equivalent for all stockholders borrowing on final settlement. It was emphasized by Mr. Jones that under existing law, it did not seem to be possible for the federal loan would not be held for interest.
