Extraordinary Session Of Idaho Legislature Passes Tax Bills And Solons Rest

Measures Allowing Levies on Incomes and Power and Providing for Constitutional Amendment Receive Quick Approval and Governor Ross Thanks Law-Making Body.

(By The Associated Press)

BOISE, March 13—The special session of the Idaho legislature adjourned tonight after passing the entire program of tax legislation asked by Governor C. Ben Ross. The measures included:

- The income tax.
- The power tax.

Adjournment was taken at 6:30 P. M. after a day spent in part in framing and debating another bill providing for creation of a tax revision commission composed of the governor and eight legislators. The measure was opposed by

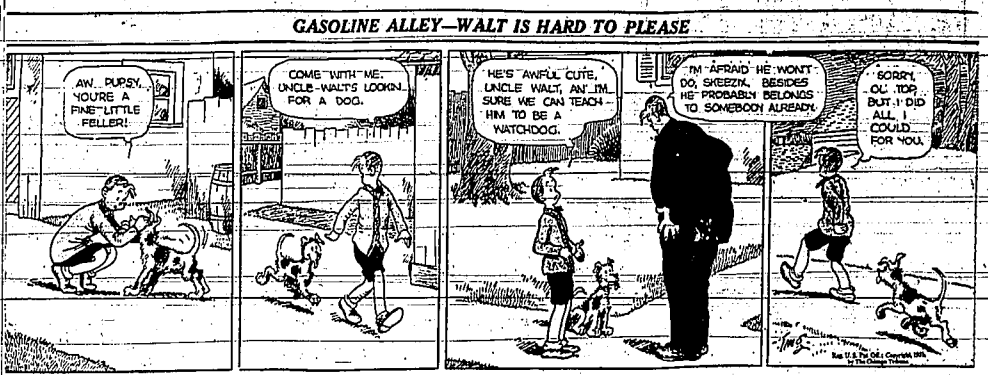
