## HIGHWAY PROGRAM SOUTH OF BURLEY RECEIVES IMPETUS

Governor C. Ben Ross and  
Commissioner . Harbour  
Take Part In Meeting  
Urging Immediate Action

**B**URLEY, March 28—Gov. C. Ben Ross and Commissioner Alvin Harbour met representatives of various organizations and individuals in meetings Declo and Burley, Saturday to consider highway problems. The matter more particularly under consideration was the location and completion of United States highway south to complete the run between Huley and Glasgow.

At the Burley meeting Mr. Harbourn explained the condition of state highway finances, calling particular attention to the disposition of state gas tax funds. He stated that the federal district highway engineer at Ogden, B. J. Pinch, had advised his office that federal funds were available for the completion of this project and also said that state funds were available as well.

—It was brought out that federal and former state highway engineers had approved a location of the proposed highway north of the railroads between Burley and Declo and that the federal officials were opposed to routing it elsewhere.

Expressions were called for from representatives of the Burley and Declo highway districts.

While expressions were generally favorable to the location of the proposed highway south of the railroad, the consensus was that rather than postpone building for another year or more, the location north of the railroad as approved

# ARMY OF "JOB-SQUATTERS" SEEKING WORK AT HOOVER DAM MAKE TEEMING CENTER OF HASTILY CONSTRUCTED TENT CITIES

## Construction Supervisor Reports More Laborers Than Needed Now on Site

2400 Job-Hunters File Personal Applications, 7000 Apply by Letter for Positions, and Reclamation Bureau at Las Vegas Receives About 12,000 Requests

LAS VEGAS, Nev., March 28.—The southern Nevada desert has become a teeming center of hastily constructed tent cities, from Las Vegas to the site of Hoover dam, 32 miles away in Black canyon on the Colorado river.

With preliminary construction work on the gigantic project now under way, 2400 men personally have filed applications for work with the federal state labor bureau here, and 7000 letters from job-hunters have been received.

Meanwhile, the United States reclamation bureau at Las Vegas has on file 12,000 additional requests from unemployed.

Frank T. Crowe, Dodge, superintendent of construction for the Reclamation, Incorporated, the San Francisco group which was awarded the contract for building the \$16,000,000 dam, said no more than 3000 men would be required at any time when work is in full swing.

Walker E. Young, construction engineer of reclamation bureau, who will represent the government at Crowe's office, said, "There are thousands in Las Vegas and the tent cities more men than will be required for construction of the dam."

But the outlook has not discouraged the job-seekers. Like those who during another era pushed in and squatted on western land to have prior right to homestead, some of these job hunters have been camping for months, awaiting call to claim to work.

Arrivals Continue  
Every day more of them arrive. They come in battered automobiles, by train and on foot, some hoping for more than a job, but others being on hand when the "big job" starts under way.

WOMEN SHOW MANY BUSINESS ABILITIES  
LAS VEGAS, Nev., March 28 (Special to The News)—A large number of the women among the job-seekers near Hoover dam have a turn for business.

One baker doughnuts in an area installed new her tent, and does a thriving business. Two girls bought a string of burros and started "touring" the desert at interest for \$4 a person.

And it is not an uncommon sight to see an amateur barber with a "chair" rigged up from boxes, waiting at a busy stand with all customers for a "shave."

The thousands already here either in tented-house or trailer camps or in their purses will not allow that "extraneous" in tent pitched at random on the desert, the rocky walls of Black canyon, or the arid bed on the bank of the muddy Colorado.

The women, however, are not so much of a bother. Many have been something of a find among the job-seekers, wives. They cook over open fires before their tents, and use packing boxes, crates or anything else for furniture.

In a tent furnished with a pocket-size table, apple-box chair and built-in bed on the sand, there often will be found a beautifully carried mirror, a plush chair, or some other piece which the family could not bear to leave behind.

Build Homes  
The men, while they have used their tent buildings frame houses from scrap lumber, or piloting shanty huts for the time being, are now planning to build permanent homes near the Hoover dam, or to the dam site.

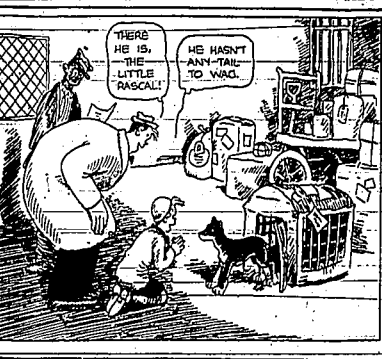

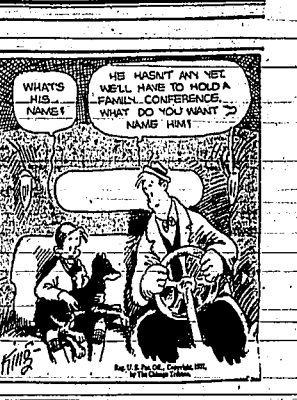
