### Knut Rockne And Seven Companions On Flight Plunge To Death In Kansas

#### Wing Falls Off Aircraft Flying Through Clouds

Eight Corpses Disfigured Almost Beyond Identification—Life In Little Town Awailing Coroners Probe

(By The Associated Press) KANSAS, March 31.—Knut Rockne, Notre Dame wizard of football, reached the end of his dynamic career near here today in the crash of an air transport plane which he had taken with his seven companions to death.

The cause of the tragedy was undisputed tonight. The witnesses, however, agreed the air liner of the Transcontinental and Western Air, Incorporated, a plane, as it soared through misty weather en route from Kansas city to the Pacific coast, was overtaken by a smaller plane.

There was one suggestion that the wing of the wing could be torn away but this was unverified.

Applicants for Aid Draw Extra Rations When Commissioners Close Supply Depot for Season

A source of provisions for approximately 50 families in and about Twin Falls closed yesterday. When J. J. Frick, member of the board of county commissioners, turned the key in the lock of the county supply depot at the rear of the Postville hotel.

Since last mid-July, when the winter crop was established, provisions have been given out there two afternoons each week to approximately 250 families. The depot was open throughout the whole period and others only once or twice. The commodities were given out in the following order: flour, sugar, rice, beans, corn, and other staples. The supply depot was closed at 2:30 p. m. yesterday.

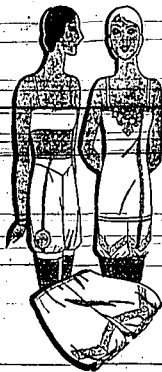

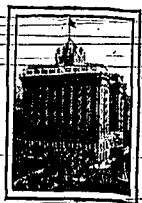
