**TWO MEN LOSE LIVES AND 10
OTHERS GO TO HOSPITALS**

WITH SERIOUS INJURIES

BERKELEY, Calif., April 8 (P.T.)—Two men were killed and 10 others were injured, six seriously, when the new wooden roof of the Mechanics building, under construction, collapsed at the University of California fair today.

Americo Cabral, Oakland laborer, died after he was crushed under the falling timbers. Another, Joseph Riley, another worker whose address had been undetermined, died late tonight from a fractured skull.

Workmen had failed to complete laying of a 100-square-yard area three feet thick above the new three-story building when shakeable beams supporting the roof collapsed, precipitating them and tons of material to the ground. One man acted an iron rod and clung to it as the roof came down.

Even men were taken to hospital where their injuries were found to range from fractured skulls, internal injuries, broken bones, and sprains to contusions.
