FAIRFIELD, April 10 (Special to The News)—Nearly everyone has a hobby, but few have the hobby of C. H. Kinney, Fairfield. By trade this genial old gentleman is a shoemaker and leather worker, but in his spare moments he has built literally dozens of fine violins.

These violins are made of the very finest woods that have been carefully selected and seasoned. Sometimes months and even years are spent on a particularly fine instrument. No two of Kinney's violins are alike. Some give a low sweet melody, while others can scream out the loudest and fiercest notes of modern jazz.

Mr. Kinney does not make these instruments alone for the money he receives, as he rarely offers one for sale. He admits it is his way of gratifying the artistic spirit within him that is his chief reason for making them. He says that the finished product may be as nearly perfect as it is possible for him to produce.

Mr. Kinney came to the Pacific in 1903 and has been engaged in the shoe and harness trade here ever since.





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
