The perjury charge was based on

it never amounted to more than \$500.

When he appeared today he

had a copy of his bank records which indicated that \$3500 was a conservative estimate of his wealth.

Commissioner of Public Welfare Pledges Active Cooperation to Maintain Institution

Idaho department of public welfare will not let Twin Falls health unit die. Commissioner of Public Welfare, John C. Lewis, director of the health unit, after an agreement was worked out in this conference and made effective May 14, 1931.

John C. Lewis, director of the state sanitary inspector's office will work with the unit and as much time here as may be necessary to carry out the unit's program.

"I am satisfied with this unit," Mr. Lewis said, "and the Bible says that where the heart is there will be treasure also. We are not going to let it just die."

Twin Falls county health unit, the first in Idaho, was established June three years ago by Paul E. Palmer.

In the beginning, the state public welfare department, federal public welfare service and the Rockefellers foundation.

No money was available from state funds, so contributions were made for maintenance of the unit here, but the department of public welfare in the past has used money from its budget for that purpose.
