**BOSTON, May 18**—Commander Donald B. MacMillan has set a new task for himself this summer, the demonstration of the far north air mail route from Boston to London and return.

It will be MacMillan's fourteenth journey north since Peary took him as his first lieutenant, in 1910, on his dash to the North Pole.

MacMillan, the commander of the navy ship, the *Thetis*, is a little school teacher, the *Thetis* will be his vehicle of exploration.

MacMillan makes the round trip safely he will be the first transatlantic aviator to do so, and it will be an achievement he will have shown that a letter mailed in Boston on Saturday afternoon can be in London Monday morning.

**CHICAGO, Ill., May 18 (AP)**—A cowboy's love for horses, nurtured on the Montana plains, twice has led Frank Latta to break freedom from the Chicago state hospital for the mentally insane.

The first time his love was successful, but yesterday his second bid for freedom came to naught. A guard picked him off with a single shot as he attempted to scale the walls. He was not seriously wounded.

## SEVEN DEATHS OCCUR AT POLLS OF EGYPT

**CAIRO, Egypt, May 18 (AP)**—Seven deaths and a number of injuries today marked the end of Egyptian elections. The deaths occurred in three villages of the Delta province, where mobs attacked the polling stations.

Premier Sidky Pasha said this evening 65 per cent of the entire electorate had voted and the verdict was in favor of the new constitution.

"I have fulfilled my promise to the country," he said in a speech. "I have introduced a new constitution. I have held the elections and the country will exist under a constitutional government."

## DOAK GIVES IDEAS ON WAGES SLASHING

**WASHINGTON, May 18 (AP)**—The administration was said today by Secretary Doak to feel that general wage reductions would be a violation of confidence by industry and would release employees of any obligation not to demand wage increases.

The labor secretary said there has been no suggestion of the administration's policy.

Meanwhile Fred C. Croston, acting chairman of the president's emergency committee for employment, held the statement of President Hoover that the steel industry's plan of labor that employees would be justified to compel a wage cut with strikes did not present any new, spread labor controversy.

He said capital and labor had worked in complete harmony for twenty years and he saw no indication that they were at a parting of the ways. He predicted, however, continuation of the depression would bring additional labor disturbances.

## PESSIMISM APPEARS UNJUSTIFIED NOW TO FINANCIAL STUDENTS

Economic Service Points to  
Encouraging Signs in  
Low Inventories and Im-  
provements for Railroads

WASHINGTON, May 18.—That as we could not share the unfounded optimism that prevailed in the spring of 1930, so we cannot now subscribe to the unjustified pessimism, says the Economic Service, in its current bulletin.

Continuing the service says: "Admittedly the record for April revealed bewildering cross-currents, and the trend of underestimation. Since the situation of such a large part of the population is focused on the stock market, the picture there has been a concerned people in many circles.

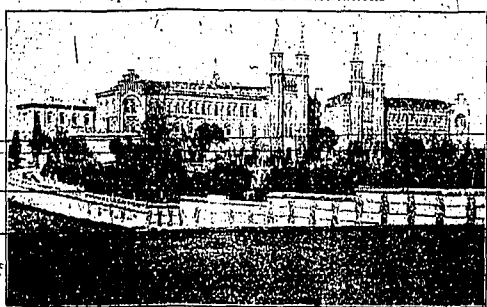

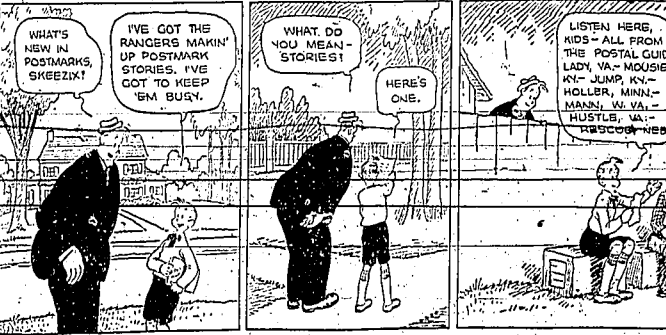

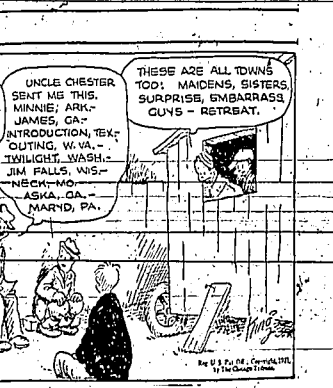
