UP CANCER CLINICS  
GAINS IN AMERICA

Society for Control of Disease Claiming 100,000 Lives in 1929 in United States Makes Suggestion

(By The Associated Press)  
NEW YORK, May 25.—Organization of special cancer hospitals, clinics and clinics throughout the United States is advocated in a report made public tonight by directors of the American Society for the Control of Cancer.

The report says that in 1929, 100,000 lives in this country in 1929, being exceeded only by heart disease as a principal cause of death, and adds:

"Barring neither infancy nor old age, cancer stands as a constant menace to the well-being of man throughout his entire early existence."

The directors of the American Society for the Control of Cancer advocate the organization of special cancer hospitals and clinics, where funds sufficient for their maintenance can be obtained from private or public sources. Where separate institutions of this nature are not obtainable, they recommend the organization of special cancer services and cancer clinics in existing general hospitals for the following reasons:

"The most effective method now available for the early diagnosis and successful treatment of cancer in its many situations consists in entrusting this responsibility to a group of interested members of the medical profession, and to a staff of nurses, with a pathologist skilled in tumor pathology, and representative of the medical profession."

Such a service can be organized in almost every large hospital in a minimum expense. It is a group made up of specialists in cancer, as in so many other fields, has already contributed materially to the advance of knowledge and has improved the results of treatment of the disease."

"Such a service or clinic has not only to the participants on the staff, but house officers and medical students, and the general staff of the hospital and the physicians of the community upon whom the hospital depends for its financial material."

"It does not seem too much to hope that the further development of such clinics throughout the country and their co-ordination through the American Society for the Control of Cancer, as a practical result, bring to reduce the mortality from this terrible disease."

SAVINGS DEPOSITS IN WESTERN BANKS GAIN

SAN FRANCISCO, May 25 (AP)—Savings in Pacific coast banks continued to pile up to new record levels for all time, the report of the San Francisco Federal reserve bank released today showed.

After having set records week after week, the trend showed no slackening last week, and on May 20 set 50 key banks held \$1,848,000,000 in time deposits. This indicated about \$2,000,000,000 in all banks of the Pacific coast.

The progress made in the last year amounted to some \$150,000,000, the same comparison showed. The steady buying power of the seven westernmost states has increased nearly 15 per cent in the last year, and now amounts to virtually \$300 on the average.

REFUSAL TO FIGHT COSTS CITIZENSHIP

Supreme Court, By Majority of One, Requires Oath to Bear Arms if Necessary

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—By a majority of one, the supreme court today decided that an applicant for citizenship must take an oath to fight, if necessary, for the United States.

This conclusion was reached in the case of *United States v. Bhargava*, a Hindu native of India, who had been naturalized in 1914.

The majority opinion, delivered by Chief Justice Hughes, was 5-4. The dissenting opinion was by Justice Brandeis.

## TWO GROUPS URGE CITY TO ACT TO CONTROL PEDDLER

Merchants and Growers Sign  
Petitions—Requesting Or-  
dinance to License Deal-  
ers in Foreign Products

Calling for an ordinance to regulate and control peddling of merchandise or produce, other than that produced in Idaho, two petitions, one signed by 47 merchants and taxpayers, and the other signed by 36 growers and taxpayers, were laid before Twin Falls city council at a special meeting last evening.

Petitions were presented by G. J. Conner, of the Twin Falls mercantile company, who last week requested the council to take action on petitions for regulation of peddlers and vegetable dealers brought here by truck from California and other states.

An ordinance which the city attorney believes will "reach the situation" contained in the petitions is in the hands of the city attorney, reported last evening.

It is the city attorney's opinion that any effective ordinance to regulate peddlers must deal in similar terms with all dealers.

**Report Consumers' Expression**  
Consumers indicated their idea that consumers may have something to say regarding proposed licensing and regulation of peddlers. It was known last evening that the council would not take any action on the proposition, but it is possible for all sides to be heard.

Another ordinance that is in course of preparation is a proposed measure to license and regulate electricians. It is known that when a city ordinance is presented to the city council, it is in the hands of the city attorney, reported last evening.

**Water Runs Short**  
Dry weather of the past several days has created a demand for water for irrigating the capacity of Twin Falls 6000-gallon water purification plant, and indications point directly to need for invoking a rule permitting each householder to draw water for irrigation purposes more than every other day.

Anderson, commissioner of streets and waterworks, announced last evening that the city council is in session tonight to consider a resolution to allow water to be drawn for irrigation purposes.

Grand company was last evening granted permission to construct a 4700 electric building and 4000 coal bin on lots in Beuna Vista addition near its big warehouse building, Harry Bell, who presented the application, said that a 15-ton scales was to be installed, the total investment being estimated at \$2500.

Twin Falls city treasurer must take \$5700 out of the bond interest and redemption fund some time before June 1, the city clerk advised the council last evening, to pay in interest charges on the city refunding bond issue.
