MOSCOW SCHOOL ABOLISHES COURSE

University of Idaho Alters
"Bonehead-English" Re-
quirements for Next Year

MOSCOW, June 15.—Special to The News.—The University of Idaho next fall, for by no chance will they land in sub-freshman English course as the result of flunking their English entrance examination.

"Bonehead English," as the course is facetiously known to students, has been abolished—at least for next year. In its stead will be substituted a system of individual or small group instruction for those freshmen found to be markedly deficient in the fundamentals of their mother tongue.

All freshmen will still be required to take English, but none in sub-freshman "bonehead" classes.

The new plan is one of the most significant academic changes approved by the faculty and board of regents in recent years. In the past, large numbers of freshmen in some of the universities, have been put into a non-credit course on the basis of examinations given before registration.

Last year the total was approximately one-third of the entire freshman class of 600 students. Some, however, were advanced to regular classes as their work improved.

Under the old plan, students were often hard-hit as an extra half-year of English would thus carefully arranged schedules, put at order for the remainder of their stay in the university. Not all students will pay even with the special assistance available under the new plan. For those willing to work, the experiment will save a half year of English, and reduce materially the percentage of freshmen required to take non-credit English work which they should have mastered in high school.

John A. Beckwith, who has had charge of the sub-freshman classes for three years, will supervise the experiment. Adding him will be Howard E. Puckettman and Ada Voss, new faculty appointments announced this week by President M. C. Stebbins.

YALE MEN AT BURLEY STUDY LOCATION FOR OREGON TRAIL TABLET

BURLEY, June 15 (Special to The News).—William H. Thompson and H. H. Switzer, Yale students studying in Burley, have returned from a trip looking over a probable location for an Oregon-Memorial tablet to be set up on the new state highway near where the California cut-off turned off to lead the emigrants to the Pacific coast.

They were accompanied by members of the Burley Explorer's club.

It was found that the flat river crossing of the new highway extending from Baranosa bar through Burley to Burley, is about one and a half miles north of the original Oregon Trail crossing.

At this point, which is a mile north of the original location of Yale postoffice, deep runs of the California cut-off trail still remain plainly in view.

On top of the rim-rocks, overlooking the old crossing, the party found several rough stone breastworks, evidently thrown up by the Indians to protect themselves from attacks of Indians from the north river lava beds west of the stream.

Directly opposite the first location of Yale postoffice, on the old Barley ranch, high up in the rim-rock and in a protected cavern, many colorful names were seen, scrawled on the rocks in black ink. The memorial tablet, to be erected on the new highway, was furnished by Yale students, from the site of memorial hall, Idaho. It is to commemorate the naming of the postoffice after this college.

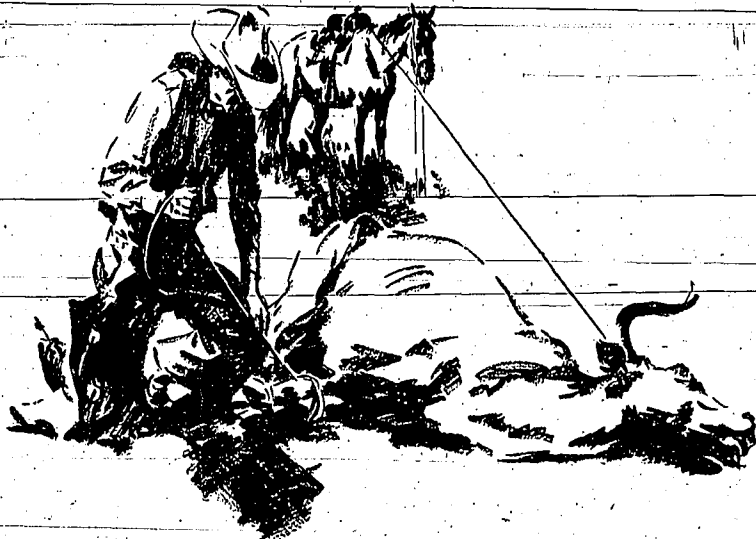

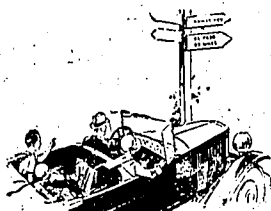
