### LADY ASTOR AND SHAW SEE SOVIET

"After All, I Was a Communist Before Lenin Was Born," Says Noted Author

MOSCOW, July 21 (AP) — George Bernard Shaw, one of the world's foremost exponents of socialism, arrived here today to survey a non-capitalist country for the first time and remarked: "After all, I was a communist before Lenin was born."

The Irish author and critic spent an active day after his arrival, surveying the Soviet capital. Less than half an hour after reaching his hotel he set out on a light-footed tour which took him to Lenin's tomb and Kremlin, where he was photographed.

Afterward, catching scarcely more than an hour's rest, he went to the park of rest and culture, a recreation center for workers on the Moscow river, and tonight he attended a special performance of "The Great Game," given in his honor.

Just as indefatigable as the noted author, was Lady Astor, who with her husband and one of her sons, among the six making up Shaw's party.

The noted lady parliamentary several times visibly shocked members of the communist party who accompanied them on their sight-seeing tour by remarking frequently, "Isn't it a capital!" and exhibiting the Soviet system for what she described as "its materialism and lack of religion."

She said the ancient little red church which stands next to the large cathedral where the czars were buried would be destroyed, Shaw said.

"Well, then, I think they'd better have a five-year scheme plan," "But," he added, "it is a revolution like this has happened in America, England or France, they would have looted everything. Such churches and art treasures as these here in the Kremlin would not have been left untouched as they have been here."

"If you stand there asking, 'Lady Astor interrupted, 'we won't cover the ground,' and she led him away by the arm."

Russia gave Shaw the glad hand when he arrived by train this morning.

### Plaintiff in Suit to Collect \$5000 From Church Tells of Odd Tenets

(BY THE ASSOCIATED PRESS) SEATTLE, July 21 — Threat of "certain death, if you cut your hair or beard" was one of the tenets of Daniel Bait, head of the Seventh Church in Seattle, taught his followers, B. H. Merrill, 38, testified today in superior court during his suit against the church for \$5000 he claimed he gave to Bait as a bribe to get out of the church.

Bait, who died several years ago, left a \$100,000 estate but no will. His sons, Arnold and Clayton, and the church are fighting for the fortune allegedly built up from the free will offerings of Bait's followers. Merrill and several ex-members are suing to regain what they claim they contributed to the communal church.

Bait's receipt regarding his work for economic relief for Germany was expressed through a high administration authority.

Acting secretary Castle of the state department made public today the American proposal to provide financial relief for Germany. The plan was first talked over with Secretary Baitman and Merrill, by (transmitted by telephone last Friday, Mr. Castle said).

The two secretaries spoke to the French and German officials about the plan. Merrill said, adding that Baitman had discussed it in the minister's meeting early today in London.

The acting secretary said he did not know if the secretary had signed the document which was made known by the Washington government but that he had put forward the plan.

In simple language, the American proposal was:

1. That world bankers should maintain the present volume of \$120,000,000 in credit to Germany.
2. That the German government should strictly enforce complete control of foreign exchange to prevent preferential or arbitrary withdrawal.
3. That a committee selected by the bank for international settlement or another authority, with bankers for renewal of outstanding credits, inquire into Germany's immediate needs for further credit and plan the conversion of short-term credits into long-term credits during the next six or eight months.

America alone in the credit volume is \$600,000,000. France's share is about \$200,000,000.

In informal explanation, Castle emphasized the proposal were not in the nature of a recommendation. He pointed to three elements considered by the United States to make the present a favorable time for such a plan.

Germany received immediate assistance in her crisis, he said, through President Hoover's debt moratorium plan, bringing relief to Germany to the extent of about \$400,000,000.

Her trade balances are favorable and increasing, Castle added, the "fight of the mark" has been stemmed and the internal banking situation regularized by domestic devices.

### SAN DIEGO MURDER TRIAL COMMENCES

Dr. Elliot G. Colby, Autopsy Surgeon, Describes Signs Young Woman's Wounds

SAN DIEGO, July 21 (AP) — Dr. E. G. Colby, county autopsy surgeon, today was the first witness in the prosecution of the murder of the 17-year-old girl, which brought pretty Helen Bradshaw had been slain between 11 P. M. July 2 and 3 P. M. July 3.

Dr. Colby said from the condition of the body he judged Miss Bradshaw had been slain between 11 P. M. July 2 and 3 P. M. July 3. He said he saw the girl's wounds and that he had seen the knife which he believed had been used to kill her.

Before Dr. Colby testified, Deputy District Attorney Sam Briscoe made the prosecution's opening statement, and A. Fairchild, Garrison's attorney, attacked the case.

WHIRLPOOL GIVES SHIP TROUBLE OFF CAPE COD

BOSTON, July 21 (AP)—A whirlpool in the ocean, 150 miles eastward of Cape Cod, so strong that it repulsed a ship, was described today by Captain William E. Frazee, of the hydrographic, one of four United States coast and geodetic survey vessels engaged in the first complete charting of George Bank.

The whirlpool was reported by Captain Frazee as a swirling eddy instead of towards its center. He said he had made several attempts to cross the whirlpool and the hydrographic, but the force of the water immediately threw the vessel off its course. He planned to investigate the phenomenon further.

Although the banks extend some 150 miles off Cape Cod, Captain Frazee said he found scarcely 12 feet of water in some of the shoal spots. One of the results of the survey probably will be the marking of such dangerous localities by the light house service. The banks, with submarine peaks and valleys, correspond to a mountainous range ashore and probably were thrown up during the last glacial period, according to Captain Frazee.
