National Amateur Tourney Lures Nation's Best Golfers

Absence Of Jones Produces Strictly Open Tournament

Lack of Dixie Threat Makes All Sections of Country Contenders For Trophy On Chicago, Beverly Links

(By The Associated Press)
CHICAGO, Aug. 28.—For the first time since 1916 the figure of Robert Tyre Jones, Jr., of Atlanta who was a show across national amateur golf tournament.

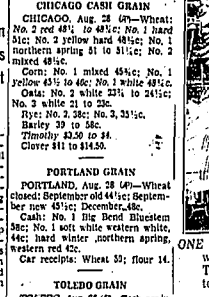
GRAIN QUOTATIONS SLUMP IN CHICAGO

Heavy Selling of Corn On Windy City Pit Breaks Promising Bull Market

CHICAGO, Aug. 28.—Heavy selling of corn, particularly September corn, broke a promising bull market and shifted prices generally lower yesterday's closing figures. Course traders said substantial discounts were taken on corn contracts, the mid-month Nebraska report showing a decline of 40 points in the price of corn. The market was influenced largely by corn shorts.

Corn closed weak at almost the bottom of its range, unchanged to 3-4 cents lower than yesterday's closing. Corn, 100 bushels, was 100.00, unchanged to 1-2 cents lower, and provisions showing 10 to 25 cents advance.
