WAR AGAINST CRIME INTERESTS WOMEN Public Welfare Group Hears Twin Falls Men Discuss Sentences and Reforms

The indeterminate sentence in criminal cases is valuable as a check upon judges' leniency, Frank S. Stephens, Twin Falls, former Idaho attorney general, told women of the Twentieth Century club's public welfare department at a meeting here yesterday.

It would be possible, Mr. Stephens said, for one to sentence a young first offender to the reformatory term while another judge might give a hardened criminal a life sentence for the same offense.

Prison reform, Ralph E. Leighton, Twin Falls police chief, told the group has been carried to an extreme where jails have almost been ruined.

It would be hard to imagine a more inhuman condition, Mr. Leighton said, than to have a child in an ordinary county jail where a youth caught with a bottle of liquor is confined for weeks in idleness with hardened criminals.

The police chief argued for restoration of prison court pilot. "It would be a waste of money to have a society in the long run, if prisoners were put to work, even if it were done by giving rocks from the pit to another."

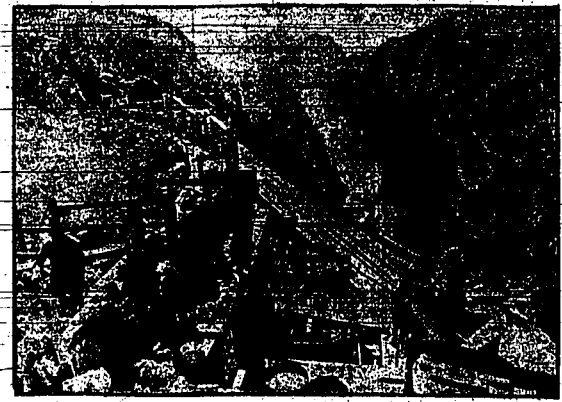
