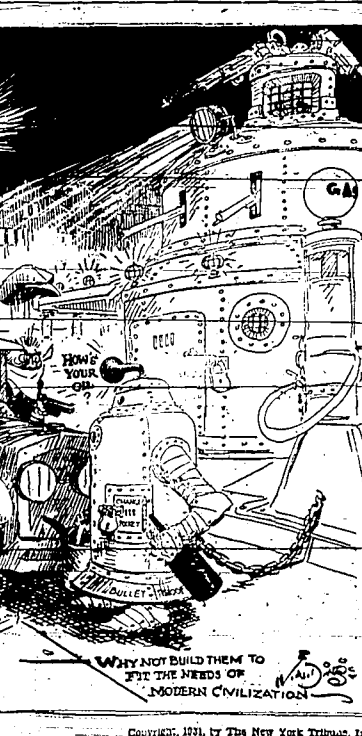

Experts Contend Golf Requires Most Skill of All Sports

Rowing Leads List In Stamina While Grid-Rates Fourth

Football Ranks First in Balance On Requirements of Strategy and Drops to Fifth Place As to Luck

BY ALAN GOULD

NEW YORK, Jan. 20 (Special to The News)—Experts here today contend that golf requires the most skill of all sports, while rowing leads the list in stamina and football ranks first in balance on requirements of strategy and drops to fifth place as to luck.

Even though this may seem only to intensify the points of argument among the country's sports experts, the fact is they have voted golf as the sport requiring the most skill as well as involving the most luck. Baseball is next on each count.

In this respect, The Associated Press athletic poll reveals a house sharply divided against itself. Otherwise there is substantial agreement that rowing requires the most strength or stamina and that football calls for the best strategy.

Only two sports, football, basketball and boxing, are voted for each of the four major factors considered in the poll. The results of the national poll showing the first five sports in each category, the number of votes for each, and the approximate percentage of the element involved, as figured by those who gave definite answers:

1. Sport requiring most skill: Golf 24 votes (60 per cent.), Baseball 10 votes (25 per cent.), Tennis 11 votes (28 per cent.), Billiards 10 votes (25 per cent.), Boxing 8 votes (20 per cent.).
2. Sport requiring most strength or stamina: Rowing 27 votes (78 per cent.), Tennis 18 votes (53 per cent.), Boxing 10 votes (29 per cent.), Football 12 votes (36 per cent.), Basketball 4 votes (12 per cent.).
3. Sport requiring most strategy: Football 17 votes (43 per cent.), Baseball 14 votes (35 per cent.), Boxing 4 votes (10 per cent.), Tennis 2 votes (5 per cent.), Chess 2 votes (5 per cent.).
4. Sport involving most luck: Basketball 7 votes (30 per cent.), Football 7 votes (30 per cent.), Horse racing 12 votes (50 per cent.), Baseball 10 votes (42 per cent.).

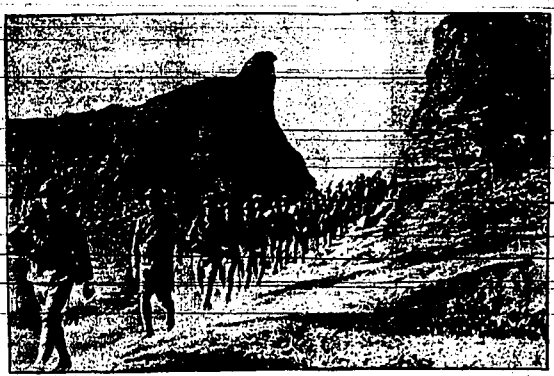

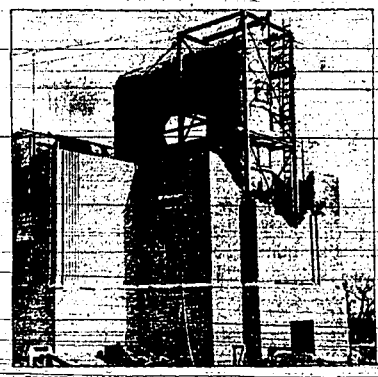

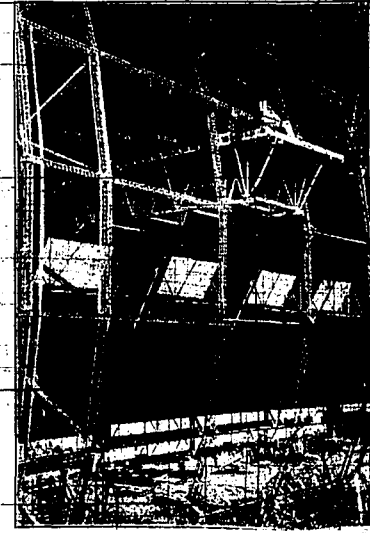
