"Sports clothes are one of the most important items in any smart American wardrobe," Lady Mendt said in an exclusive interview with The Associated Press.

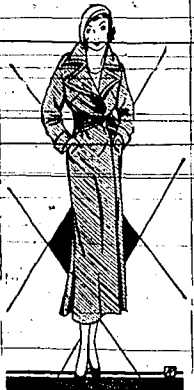
